NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 2. That each of said bonds and each of the interest coupons to be thereto attached shall be in substantially the following forms:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That the City of Highland Park in the County of Lake and State of Illinois, acknowledges itself to owe and for value received hereby promises to pay to bearer, or if this bond be registered, then to the registered holder hereof, the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) on the First day of September, 1926, together with interest and one-half per cent (4 1/2%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the First days of March and September in each year upon presentation and surrender of the interest coupons hereof attached as they severally become due and payable. Both principal and interest hereon are hereby made payable and demandable in lawful money of the United States of America at the Harris Trust & Savings Bank, Chicago, Illinois.

SECTION 3. That for the purpose of providing the funds required to pay the interest on said bonds promptly when and as the same falls due, and to pay and discharge the principal thereof at maturity, there be and there is hereby levied upon all the taxable property within said City in each year while any of said bonds are outstanding, a direct annual tax sufficient for that purpose, and that there be and there is hereby levied on all of the taxable property in said City, in addition to all other taxes, the following direct annual tax, to-wit:

SEVENTH PRECINCT shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: Beginning at the East Quarter corner of Section 9, Township 43 North, Range 12 East of Third Principal Meridian; thence West on the East and West Quarter line of aforesaid Section 9 and on the East and West Quarter line of Section 8, Township and Range aforesaid, to the center of aforesaid Section 8; thence South on the North and South Quarter line of aforesaid Section 8 and on the North and South Quarter line of Section 17, Township and Range aforesaid, to the center of Section 17; thence East on the East and West Quarter line of aforesaid Section 17 to the Northeast corner of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of aforesaid Section 17; thence South on the Quarter line of the Southeast Quarter of aforesaid Section 17 to the Southeast corner of the Southwest Quarter of aforesaid Section 17 to the corner of Section 7, Township and Range aforesaid, thence East on the South line of aforesaid Section 17 to the corner of Sections 21, 16 and 9, Township and Range aforesaid, to the place of beginning; all in Lake County, Illinois.
