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### VACATION TIME IS ACCIDENT SEASON

WITH CHILDREN ON STREET

#### Motor Club Urges Redoubled Care on Part of Drivers During Period When Youngsters Are Released

Vacation time is danger time for children of school age, according to the accident prevention department of the Chicago Motor club, which yesterday issued a warning calling motorists' attention to the increased traffic hazard and urging parents to redouble their efforts to keep children from playing in the streets.

"With the beginning of the summer school vacation, the season of games with us again," the safety bulletin points out. "Thousands of children are prone to use the streets of the cities and towns as playgrounds during the vacation period and the motorist will find more of them to look out for than during the months when all the school are in session.

"Children released from the restraint and protection of school attendance are tempted to use the streets for their games and play and are in greater danger than during the school season. Parents should use every effort to guard the children's lives by impressing on them the dangers involved in playing in the street and the necessity for the utmost care.

**Proper Places**

"Regular playgrounds and vacant lots are the proper places for school children to carry on vacation games, and parents should co-operate to the extent of impressing this forcibly on their children.

"Drivers, too, must exercise greater caution to prevent accidents to children during the vacation season. Motorists who were accustomed to find few children on the streets during school hours will find surprises at every turn in their city driving if they are not extremely careful to anticipate the situation."

### SYNTHETIC HOUSES, PREDICTS EXPERT

#### Composition Floors and Resinoid Woodwork Inside Are in Prospect

Tomorrow's houses are to be synthetic. This is the prophecy, which has a substantial basis of fact, that Dr. Gerald Wendt, director of the Division of Industrial Research, Pennsylvania State college, makes in the Nation's Business.

"Concrete, stucco, composition roofings," he says, "are here to stay; steel frames and even steel walls have been effectively used in model houses. Next will come composition floors, fireproof, and of any desired hardness or color; resinoids in place of all interior wood work, including furniture; lacquered and washable walls in place of wallpaper; rayon textiles for draperies dipped in compositions so that they, too, can be washed with a sponge, and luminous paints which will give a soft, natural light without consumption of energy.

"With this will come further extension of electric power to heat the home by winter and cool it throughout the summer.

"None of the suggestions is a vague dream; all are based on realities which are kept from popular use only by present cost figures."

### PRESIDENT GIVING FISHING BIG BOOST

#### All Isaac Waltons of Country Interested in the Coolidge Performance

All the Isaac Waltons of the country over are coming into their own by reason of the interest which the President has displayed in fishing. A canvass made the other day at the sporting goods stores in Washington, revealed the fact that boys, girls, young men and young women, as well as a number of the old folks, aroused by the success which the President has had, were flocking to the stores for the purpose of purchasing tackle. The Potomac which is a river composed of water with very little fish, that is at least within the district limits, has always been whipped by a certain number of enthusiasts and stalwarts, who secure their pleasure in playing at fishing, wholly apart from their success in running a catch.

District policemen, however, report that there has been a very substantial increase now in the number of people, who from bridges, ledges, canoes, dugouts and skiffs, have taken up the pursuit of fishing. New York and Chicago sporting goods houses report also a very substantial increase in their sales of fishing tackle. It is rather interesting, and evidence how closely after all, the people of the country are interesting themselves in the activities of the President.

### COOLIDGE WORKING HARD IN VACATION

#### Ten Hours a Day Occupied and Official Business Gets Due Attention

Newspaper observers at White Pine Camp, where the President is vacationing, report that instead of an eight hour day, he is running a ten hour day up there. With the private telegraphic wires direct to Washington, and the telephone trunk lines, there is no interruption in the daily grind of work. Twice a day letter bags are dispatched for Washington containing the mail, and it is given the same attention and carried on with the same exactness and correctness equal to conditions when the President's view extended simply to the White House grounds instead of as now into the New York wilderness behind him. The President is fortunate, and the American people are fortunate in the fact that he secures a fine sense of enjoyment from the opportunity to work. Indeed, there is no denying, he would be a rather unhappy man if in any way he was shut off from this chance to carry on. Absolutely characteristic of the man, was the development of the fact that when Secretary Sanders had to take to his bed because of illness, and Mr. Clark, his confidential secretary, had to leave on a personal trip, in the emergency the President took all the mail himself and disposed of the major part of it at first hand and without any intermediaries.

### MODERN DYESTUFFS EQUAL OF ANY AGE

#### Dept. of Agriculture Declares They Are as Fast and as Beautiful

Modern dyestuffs can be just as fast and give just as beautiful colors, as any used in past times, says the United States department of agriculture. It is sentiment chiefly that makes us cling to the idea that the natural dyes obtained from plants and animals are best. Many of them are lovely colors, it is true, and the time that has passed since the cloth was dipped in the dye pot has in many cases mellowed the tones and made them even lovelier. Many of the so-called artificial dyes used now are exactly the same from the chemical standpoint as those from berries and bark and other natural sources. In some cases the new dyes are better than the old. The modern manufacturer of dyestuffs knows what is in them, and for that reason is surer of results.

### CAR DRIVERS SHOULD OBSERVE COURTESY

One should show his breeding when he is driving a car as well as when he is in the drawing room. The boorish driver is not truly a gentleman. Robbins B. Stoekel, commissioner of motor vehicles of the state of Connecticut has prepared a code of ethics or good manners for motorists. Among other things he points out that drivers should avoid driving through water or mud in such a way as to splash it on pedestrians; should give proper warning to pedestrians and others using the streets or highways; should not use the horn to signal persons inside of a house, thus disturbing the whole neighborhood; should remain in the proper place when halted by a traffic officer, instead of crowding out among the pedestrians; should not try to "hog" the middle of the road; should at all times show consideration for and due courtesy toward others on the road.

When the kids raid their neighbor's fruit trees, they should leave enough behind so these neighbors will be encouraged to grow some more next year.

### RADIO'S OPPORTUNITY FOR SELF-GOVERNMENT

An opportunity to demonstrate that self-government in business is more than a fanciful ideal is pointed out by the Nation's Business to the radio industry.

"Congress," it says, "failed to finish its task of radio regulation. Courts have rendered confusing decisions as to the power of the Department of Commerce to allot wave lengths. The Attorney-General has said that while an applicant for a license must designate a wave length, he is at liberty to use others.

"All of which opens the way to limitless confusion in broadcasting unless—

"Business regulates itself!

"The radio industry—that is, the broadcasting side of it—has a fine chance.

"To write itself down as shortsighted, as indifferent to the rights of competitors and the public, or "To set an example of self-control and self-regulation by proper respect for the rights of others even though those rights be not enforceable at law.

"Let us not forget that if business cannot or will not govern itself, then government can and will."

### PROTEIN IN MEAT SUPERIOR TO BEANS

Many people believe that beans, such as the navy, lima and other kinds of dried beans, are substitutes for meat from the standpoint of their nutritive value. Recent research by the United States Department of Agriculture on the kind of protein contained in different foods has shown that the protein of meat is superior to that of beans from the standpoint of meeting the needs of the body. The protein in meat is called "complete" or "efficient" while that in beans is called "incomplete," because it lacks certain essential acids. The average meal that Americans eat, however, usually contains bread and other foods that contain some kind of protein. Generally a combination of these with the protein in beans will supply the body what it needs. So far as nutritive value goes it is therefore all right to use beans occasionally in place of meat for dinner.

### REDUCED FARES FOR BIG CHICAGO RODEO

#### Excellent Service on Northwestern Railroad Promised; Many Features

Excellent service and reduced rates will be provided by the Chicago & Northwestern railway for the thousands who contemplate attending the world's cowboy and cowgirl championships at Chicago, August 14 to 22, inclusive. More than \$35,000 in prizes will be paid in the various events.

Last year more than 250,000 persons attended the Chicago Rodeo, which is held annually in Soldiers Field, Grant Park. A system of flood lighting makes the arena as light as day for the night contests.

The most daring and skillful cowboys and cowgirls from all over the west will compete at Chicago. At least seven of the present eight world's champions will be there to defend their titles.

The contests include steer wrestling, steer riding, bareback and saddle bronk riding, relay races, trick and fancy roping, trick and fancy riding, calf roping, and other events for both the cowgirls and cowboys.

The most unbreakable bronks and the wildest steers are taken to Chicago for the contests. The bronks and steers are gathered from all over the west, approximately \$25,000 being spent in getting several hundred head of the live stock to test the skill of the contestants.

### PLAN NEW TRAINS TO PACIFIC COAST
