

WHAT IS "LIBERAL" IN RUSSIAN SYSTEM

SOME INSTANCES SHOWN

Must "Bootleg" Dancing; Possession of Gold Teeth Hostile to Socialism; Sale of Wife Legal

The National Republic (Washington) prints each month much startling information about the activities of subversive forces aiming at the overthrow of the American government, in the United States, with special attention to the agitation of agents and sympathizers of soviet Russia. In the current issue the National Republic says:

Bootleg Dancing
"Liberal" sympathizers with soviet Russia in the United States often deplore the "narrow mindedness" and "Puritanism" of America. Books describing these alleged characteristics of the United States are very popular in Russia and in European radical circles generally as well as among the self-styled "intelligentsia" of the United States. It is interesting to note in this connection that if a young Russian communist attends a dance he must "boot-leg" the amusement.

"This was revealed by Mr. Tomski, head of the bolshevik financial delegation to Paris, in a recent speech at Moscow, at a meeting in which representations were made to the bolshevik central board that it would be better to permit dancing openly than to have it carried on clandestinely.

"One provincial communist organization in Russia, deliberating on the case of a comrade who had lost four teeth in a fight and had them replaced with gold teeth, decided that the possession of gold teeth must be considered a fact hostile to socialism and its ideas, and that the gold teeth of Stepanov must be taken from him, and in case of protest he must be excluded from the communist party.

O. Very "Liberal"
"In other respects, of course, Russian communism is quite 'liberal.' The local village council of Sabotinova district decided that a contract made by Comrade Grisha Semerenko for the sale of his wife to Comrade Nikiti Nevelitcha for five bottles of vodka was legal. In the village of Bogdanovitch in the Perm district near the Ural Mountains, according to one of the official Moscow papers (The Messenger), 2,670 pails of home-made vodka and 4,985 of home-made beer, costing 67,000 rubles, were consumed at 334 weddings, 7,790 people participating in the festivities, with an average consumption of about one pail of intoxicants per guest."

PROPER CARE OF WASHERS

If you have an electric washing machine, says the U. S. department of agriculture, be sure to pull out the electric plug when leaving the machine between wash days and coil the connecting cord where it will not collect moisture and dirt. Do not lubricate or adjust any part of the washer while the cord is connected to the current source. CENTPEDE GRASS GOOD FOR SOUTHERN STATES

Centipede grass introduced from China by the U. S. department of agriculture and tested several years at Tifton, Ga., Gainesville, Ga., and McNeil, Miss., promises to rejuvenate southern pastures, says H. N. Vinall, who is engaged in forage investigations. Several patches of the grass put out in hill pastures at these stations remained alive and green through the extremely dry summers of 1924-25. The new grass spread into the native grasses growing adjacent, giving every indication of being very aggressive and drought resistant.

The original small sample of seed came to the department from the Province of Hunan in China and was known as Hunan grass. It was renamed by Dr. Piper because of its long surface runners, or stolons, which in their numerous root connections in the soil somewhat resemble the centipede.

In its early growth the grass is protected from grazing animals, by the closeness with which the runners and leaf blades adhere to the ground. After it becomes somewhat thick on the ground the leaves take an upward turn, growing on an average about 3 or 4 inches high. It makes an excellent pasture, is readily eaten by livestock, and remains green when the native grasses have dried up. It may also be used for lawns and golf greens. Carpet grass is perhaps the best grass for moist sandy soils, says Mr. Vinall, but centipede grass used on the dry parts of the pasture will make supplemental forage of equal quality.

The new grass may be propagated either vegetatively or by seed. However, the vegetable method is rather expensive and has the disadvantage of destroying the original patch from which the runners or stolons are obtained. New areas have been started at the three stations for supplying vegetative propagating material, but this source of supply will be quite limited for some time to come. Seed is not generally produced in quantities in this country. However, plans

PRINT SHOWS MANY AND INTERESTING

Numerous Producers Represented in Displays at the Art Institute

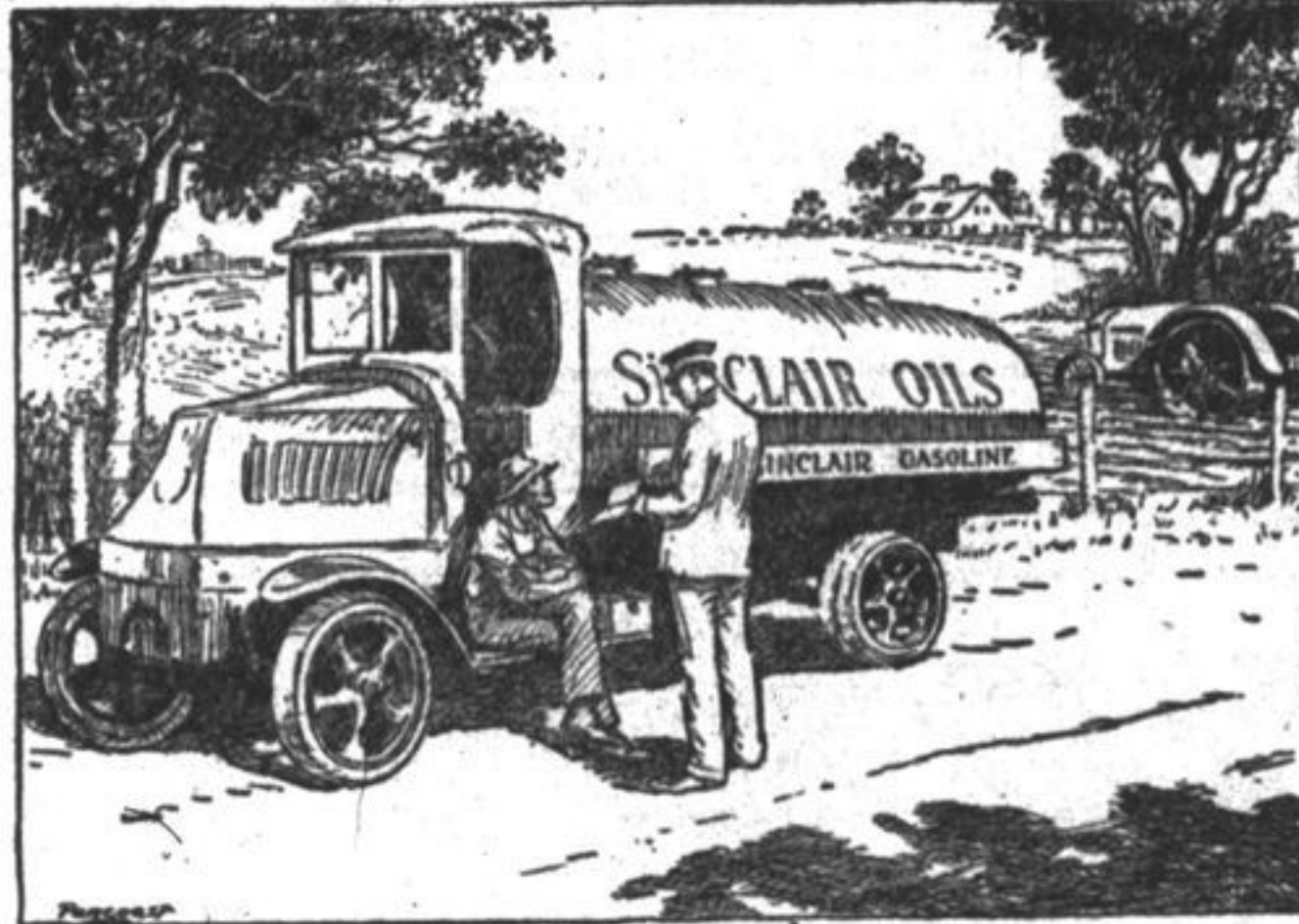
