LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS' MEETING

SESSION AT WINNETKA

National Board of Organization Has Six-Day Conference In That Town; Some Social Affairs Also

With three strictly social affairs scheduled for the national board of the League of Women Voters, which met last week at the home of Mrs. William Gold Hibbard, Winnetka, the board brought a busy and successful six-day session to a close. On Wednesday, September 15 the local presidents in Cook county were invited to tea at Mrs. Hibbard's, to meet the national board. The next day, Mrs. Frank Hixon of Lake Forest, deputy director in place of Mrs. Hibbard entertained at dinner followed by a reception for the Lake Forest league, and Friday, September 17, the Winnetka league met them at a tea at Mrs. William Browne Hale's.

There were fifteen women from California to Maine, holding three daily sessions, 9 to 12:30, 2 to 5, and 7 to 10, laboring over national policies and methods of carrying on their work of education of women to the problems of administration and government.

Each one is vitally interested in the league as a national influence by non-partisan education, and, of course, in their particular locality. Mrs. James E. Cheesman, first regional director, of Rhode Island, who has six states within her territory, for four years was president of the Rhode Island league. From that position she advanced to regional director with Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and Virginia under her jurisdiction. The daughter of a well-known educator in the east, Mrs. Cheesman admitted that when the league began she was unconvinced as to its worth. But she read about it, studied about it, and has become one of its most valuable members.

"To make American women, thinking women, to make voters, thinking voters, is our intention," Mrs. Cheesman said. "Our purpose is not to dictate what to think but what to think about," she added.

Mrs. Cheesman feels that the league is not trying to do away with parties in politics as many think, but to better those necessary parties by adding women to their ranks who understand the meaning of a vote, who are following the bills presented to congress, who are thinking.

SPEED TRAP BOARD APPROVES OFFICERS

Lake Bluff and Libertyville Men Are Declared O. K. By Investigators

The speed trap investigation being staged by the Chicago Motor club in Lake county last week approved three Lake county officers, Motorcycle Policeman G. Edwards of Lake Bluff, Justice of the Peace Lyell Morris and Justice of the Peace H. M. Bartlett both of Libertyville, as being "square" officials. No complaints have been made against any of the three and the investigation shows nothing but legal procedure and fair treatment for all.

Patrolman Edwards, who lives at 340 North avenue, Lake Bluff, has a good record. Since the first of the year he has made 130 arrests, 71 of which were speeders, 19 cases were dismissed and the balance were for other auto violations such as parking, lights and other such causes. Edwards gets no part of the costs of the cases, has been named in no complaints and is listed as a good officer doing a good work in a systematic and legal manner.

"Judge" Morris, of Libertyville, has held his position for 13 years and has had but 20 cases since the first of the year. Bartlett has been conducting his court without a complaint from anyone and while the arrests listed are being tabulated for the investigation, it is doubtful if any complaint will be returned with the club's questionnaire.

MANY N. S. GIRLS IN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL
