MCCORMICK SUBWAY NEAR COMPLETION

Boulevard From Devon Avenue to West Railroad in Evanston Open Soon

The last square yard of concrete paving was laid on the million dollar six-mile McCormick road last week. As soon as this short stretch of new paving has time to cure—a matter of 28 days—the boulevard will be opened for its entire length from Devon avenue in Chicago to West Railroad avenue in Evanston.

Philip Harrington, assistant chief engineer of the Sanitary district which has built the boulevard, stated the new thoroughfare should be opened some time in the first half of October.

The completion of the boulevard was held up all this year by delay in building a subway under the tracks of the North Western's Mayfair division at Oakton street and the drainage canal. The boulevard was completed last year up to the tracks on both sides. Numerous obstacles arose which delayed the joining of the two sections through the subway.

But all was done at the subway except for a few finishing touches early this week. The concrete paving along the floor of the subway was all laid, and there remained only two small areas of asphalt surfacing to be completed.

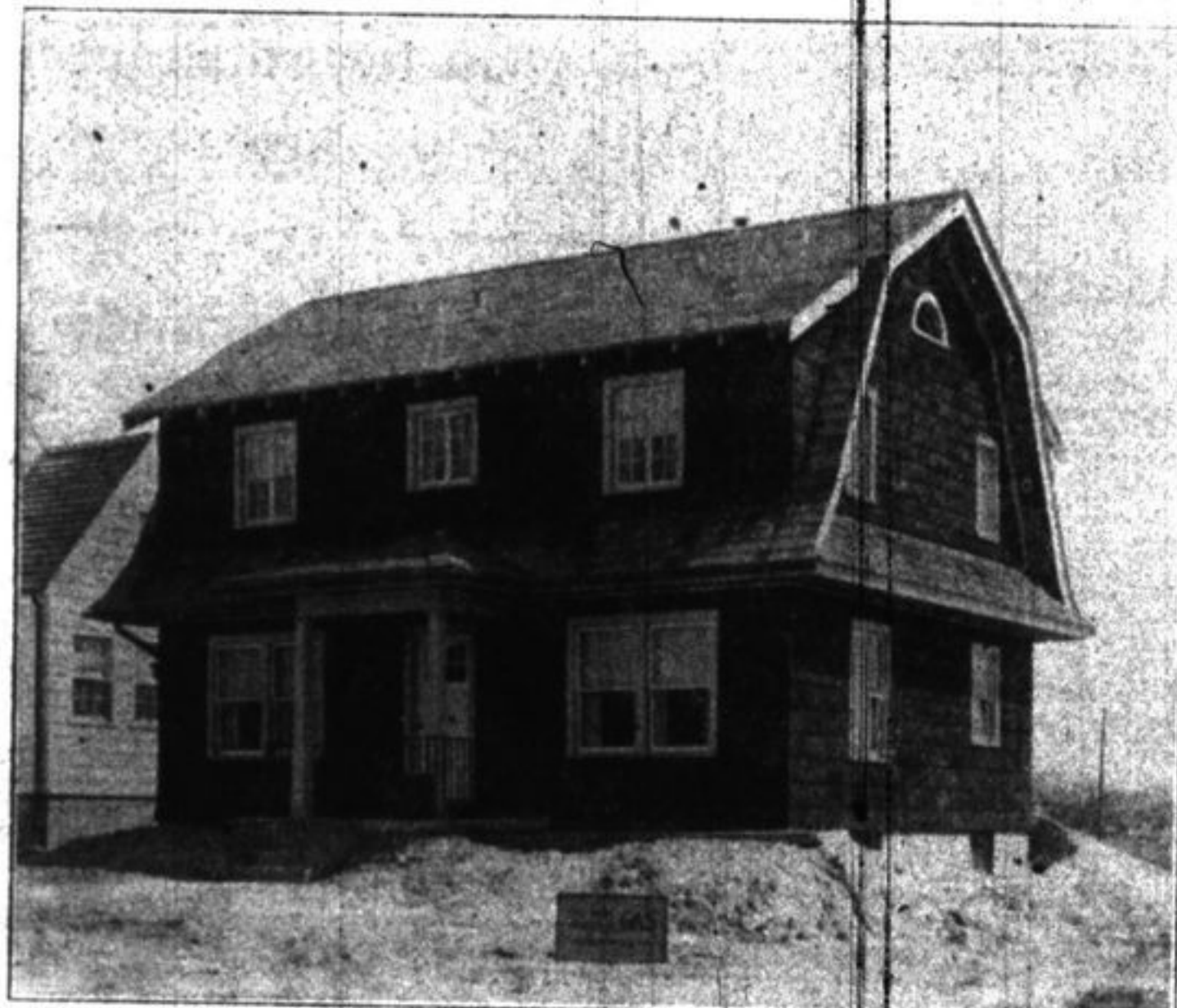

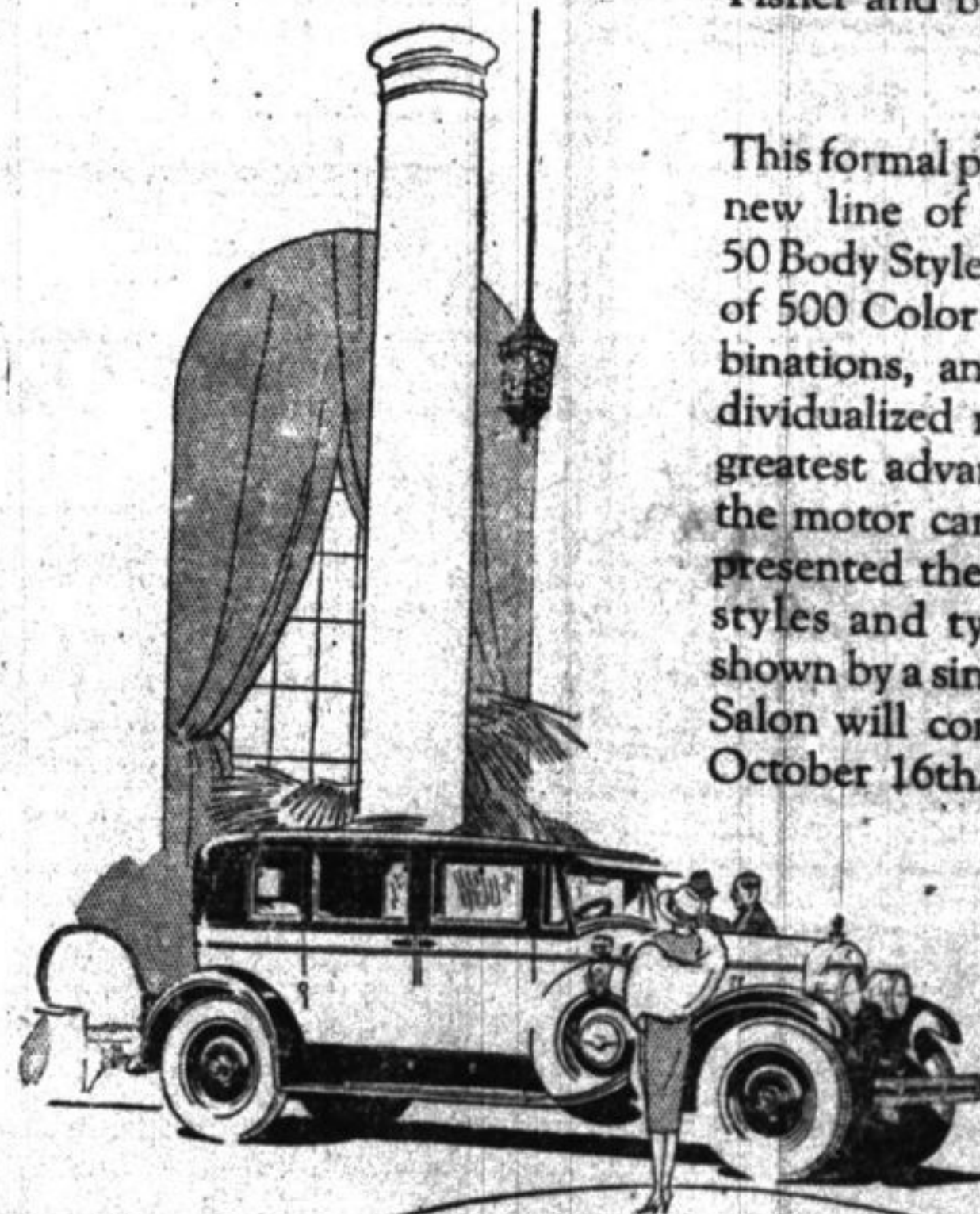
