The item is listed as "proceeds of amateur circus given by Ernest Harvey and James Sanders of Greenville, Maine, \$1.50," and the report shows that the money was spent, as requested by the donors, in providing 32 meals for Armenian orphans.

Ernest and Jim, it is stated, are years old, whose sympathy with the orphans of Bible Lands was aroused through their school teacher. They decided to sake a contribution to the work, and thought that it would be more fun to earn the money than to ask father and mother for it. For days they toiled in preparation for an elaborate circus, to which all the boys and girls of the neighborhood were invited, at an entrance fee of one cent each. The success of their enterprise is attested by the fact that the profits! from the performance were \$1.50, which duly arrived at the Near East Relief offices in Alexandropol, and was spent with the same careful observance of the donors' wishes, as if it had bene a donation of hundreds or thousands.
