OPEN HOUSE SUCCESS

Plants During Last Week; Large Increase

More than 21,000 persons became better acquainted with the Public Cervice company of Northern Ill nois by means of personal visits to the company's gas and electricity manufacturing plants during "open house week," October 4 to 9. This is more than three times as many took advantage of "open house" op portunities last year.

Although Waukegan and Joliet where the company's principal electrical generating stations are situated, attracted the largest individual parties of visitors, the 21,000 persons represented in fairly equal proportion, the 278 communities which are served by the company.


