Also to Furnish Younger Women Accurate Data on Vocations Open to Them; Wages and Other Matters

The moot question of how large a proportion of American business women have dependents and thus qualify on an economic basis for equal pay with men for equal work bids fair to be settled for all time.

The means of settlement will be effected through the most elaborate national survey of the business women's field that has ever been conducted. The survey will be made this year by the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs through its personnel research committee, which is headed by Miss Margaret Elliott of the faculty of the CANNOT RECOGNIZE University of Michigan.
