

BONDING MEASURES PASS CITY COUNCIL

A communication was received from the civic committee of the Woman's club requesting that the council hasten the installation of gates at the Biergate crossing on Deerfield road, reciting the fact that two lives were recently lost at this point and expressing fear that an accident similar to that in which a school bus was struck recently at Northbrook, might happen at the crossing in question.

The communication was signed by Mrs. J. A. Reichelt, Jr., chairman of the crossing committee and Mrs. Tom R. Wyles, secretary of the civic committee of the club.

Council Acts

On motion of Commissioner Cheney the city clerk was directed to acknowledge receipt of the communication and inform the committee regarding the plans for crossing protection at this point. Then Commissioner Cheney moved that the Chicago, North Shore & Milwaukee Railroad Co. be directed to maintain a 24-hour watchman service at their Biergate crossing. The motion prevailed. It is understood that plans are under way for the erection of gates at this point.

Commissioner Gourley moved that the ornamental street lighting system installed by Baird & Warner in their addition to Deer Park subdivision be accepted, providing it should pass the scrutiny of the corporation counsel.

Bond Ordinances Pass

The ordinances providing for raising money by issue of bonds, etc. were then put upon final passage, first of which was the ordinance providing for borrowing money and issuing of bonds in the sum of \$8,000 for incinerator plant improvement, and providing for collection of a direct annual tax for payment of principal and interest, the ordinance having remained on file for public inspection the required length of time according to law. The same is true of the other bond ordinances passed, including one for \$35,000 for general corporate purposes, \$30,000 for water works bonds, \$25,000 for sewer bonds.

Commissioner Cheney moved that the corporation counsel be directed to prepare an amendment to the zoning ordinance in accordance with the recommendations of the zoning committee and that he requests the zoning committee to call a public hearing on said amendment.

Board Meets

At the meeting of the board of local improvements the paving of an alley in block 5 was originated, and the first estimate for I. D. Lane, contractor for the southeast paving improvement, was filed and approved.

The high school band will play "The Star Spangled Banner" and "America." The complete program will be printed in the Press next week.

Jens Jensen, the well known landscape architect, will landscape the park after the dedication of the memorial.

Civic Problem Discussed; Mrs. J. C. Morrison Makes Report; Musical Program

A regular meeting of the Highland Park Woman's club was held on Tuesday, Nov. 2. Mrs. James C. Morrison gave a short report of the meeting of the new Lake County Federation of Women's clubs which was held at the Waukegan Woman's club on November 1.
