

NOVELTIES FEATURE LONDON RADIO SHOW

INTERESTING EXHIBITION

Extraordinary Ingenuity Shown by Manufacturers in Designs; Other Things Described

A beautiful silver rose bowl which is really a loudspeaker in disguise and a receiving set which works 200 headphones and 12 loudspeakers with the greatest ease were two of the most intriguing of the wonders to be seen at the first National Radio exhibition in London, England.

Extraordinary ingenuity has been shown by many of the makers in the designs adopted for both loudspeakers and receiving sets, many of the latter being inclosed in cabinets of quite unusual beauty. Even aerial can now be purchased which to the uninitiated present themselves as nothing but artistic and well-designed lampshades, while the camouflaging of loudspeakers has been carried to the limit of inventiveness, says the Christian Science Monitor.

One of the most interesting takes the form of a picture, framed in the ordinary way and hanging at the usual angle on the wall, and it is only on looking behind it that it is possible to see that it is provided with all the mechanism of a loudspeaker.

Price Higher
Articles such as these are, of course, priced rather higher than the more ordinary models, but there is plenty of variety in the matter of cost to suit all pockets, the prices ranging from a few shillings to \$185. One of the most ingenious and original of the receiving sets is a container in a portable cabinet, containing valves, batteries and loudspeaker. It is worked by a single touch of a switch, without aerial or earth, and is described by its inventor as anticipat-

ing the improvements or years to come.

Other exhibits which are attracting attention are several forms of battery eliminators, which save the trouble of renewing batteries and recharging accumulators, making use instead of the household electricity supply, while an even more novel invention is a time switch for use with receivers. By the insertion of plugs in sockets round the face of a clock the switch is automatically turned on at any desired time. The insertion of one plug keeps the set in action for half an hour, two for an hour, and so on, and there is said to be an error of not more than a minute or so in its working.

Novelties on Increase

From this it will be seen that novelties are, on the increase, and whatever their value from the purely technical point of view, there is no question that they act as a stimulant to the industry by the attraction they have for the ordinary public. And it is not as though the improvements in design were only improvements in appearance. Every single component part of the various types of receiving sets has been the subject of prolonged study by the makers, resulting in increased efficiency and wearing quality, and there is hardly a department of wireless in which a marked advance is not registered as compared with last year.

EUROPE HAS CHANGED LITTLE IN CENTURY

In Regard to Viewpoint; Washington's Warning Still Holding Good

Europe has changed but little, in its political psychology in the last century and a quarter. The boundaries of the nations have changed, some countries have grown greater and others have vanished. But the American viewpoint might well remain the same. President Washington, as every American well knows, in his farewell address issued a word of warning to

Americans about the mixing into the quarrels and dissensions of Europe. In the current issue the National Republic quotes a letter written by George Washington to Lafayette in 1791 at a time when Washington was president of the United States. The letter, which seems almost entirely applicable today follows:

"While in Europe, wars or commotions seem to agitate almost every nation, peace and tranquility prevail among us, except in some parts of our western frontier, where the Indians have been troublesome, to reclaim or

chastise whom, proper measures are now pursuing. This contrast between the situation of the people of the United States and those of Europe is too striking to be passed over, even by the most superficial observer, and may I believe, be considered as one great cause of leading the people here to reflect more attentively on their own prosperous state, and to examine more minutely, and consequently approve more fully, of the government under which they live, than they otherwise would have done. But we do not wish to be the only people

who may taste the sweets of an equal and good government. We look with an anxious eye to the time when happiness and tranquility shall prevail in your country, and when all Europe shall be freed from commotion, tumults and alarms."
