DISCUSSES RIGHTS OF AUTO PURCHASER IS IMPORTANT FACTOR

Expert Writes of Salesmanship and Other Things Entering into Deal; Primary Requisites

The statement of President Clarence C. Little, of the University of Michigan, that "the ordinary type of instruction in the American college is not at all respected and is very little feared intellectually by the average college student" is causing much surprise in the ranks of educators and college authorities. The statement is made in the leading article in the November Scribner's Magazine, just published.

President Little utters other opinions which are likely to cause certain authorities to look askance, for he has definite ideas concerning the brand of Christianity which ought to be offered to college boys and he calls the by-now famous report of Committee of the American Association of University Professors on the restriction of inter-collegiate athletics "one more document calculated to widen the already serious breach between faculty and students."

Scores Tactics

Dr. Little, who is one of the youngest college heads in the country, attacks the cold and impersonal regimentation of college students. He cites the military language of the college rules and regulations and the committee report mentioned above as slave-driving tactics.

"The student," says President Little, "does not appreciate or co-operate with a system of rules and pronouncements made ex cathedra for the purpose of the convenience of those occupied in administration. He avoids or resists them at every opportunity. He will, on the other hand, if we allow him the chance, eventually understand and participate in disciplinary measures which are based primarily upon the belief that he is and desires to be inherently decent, physically, mentally, and morally."

We shall have to descend from the pedestal and prepare to meet them as they are—not as an atmosphere of cloistered academic calm would like to have them."

President Little then goes on to discuss the student's attitude toward religion.

"What he feels about his education is, I believe, also very largely denominational Christianity," he continues. "Various articles have been written and many sermons preached on the godless nature of our present-day college students. Nothing seems to me to be farther from the truth. To be sure, they recognize and comment unfavorably on certain phases of our interpretation of Christianity—they decline to participate to anything resembling a general degree in 'organized' worship. These signs are tremendously disturbing to many of the older generation.

"If we are to save our college students for participation in any confessed form of Christianity, it seems certain that we must recognize their rather extensive non-participation in denominational worship. We must follow this up by realizing that they feel the need of some more general and liberal form of approach to Christianity than is usually provided. Once

these things are done, one is in a fair way to move rapidly along the channel of thought which students themselves are following. For the most part, one finds them keen, alert, and far more courageous in matters social and spiritual than we were at their age."

BULLETIN ADVISES HOW TO BACK AUTO

Motor Club Offers Suggestions to Drivers Regarding This Feature

"When a motorist starts up or backs out of his garage with a lurch, a serious accident may be the result," says Charles M. Hayes, president of the Chicago Motor Club. "For this reason, the simple art of starting should be practiced by the driver who aims to have a 'no accident' record."

The first precaution is to see that the hand brake is set. The clutch should then be thrown out. This saves wear on the battery and is also a safety measure. The starter then should be turned over with the ignition off to get a supply of gas in the shammers. The cautious motorist of course, will have his gears in neutral. His next move will be to shift to low or to reverse as the case may be and release the hand brake and apply the power gently.

"In backing out of the garage, the sounding of the horn is not sufficient. The driver should make a practice to

see that on one is standing or walking near the rear of his car. The driver who observes such precautions will never become involved in a starting accident."

Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "The harmony and immortality of man are intact. We should look away from the opposite supposition that man is created materially, and turn our gaze to that which should be engraved on the understanding and heart 'with the point of a diamond' and the pen of an angel" (p. 521).
