playing their last game for Deerfield and they were trying to make a good showing. They did.

New Trier lost their one chance to score when they blocked a punt in the second period and the ball rolled to Deerfield's 15-yard line. Five New Trier warriors were after it with not a Deerfield man within 20 yards of them. One of the New Trier players tried to pick it up, but it slipped off the end of his fingers three times and finally it was a blue-jersey player who fell on the oval.

After Hammond ripped off tackle for thirty yards the half ended with the score 7-0 in favor of Deerfield.

Third Is See-Saw

Coach Peel did not start his regular backfield in the second half and although Hammond, Baker, Behrens and Colclasure seemed to gain at will, New Trier was fighting harder so that they also gained.

The third quarter was the most even of the game. Baker, Hammond, Behrens and Colclasure would carry the ball down the field only to have the Paletti brothers, Jackett, and Burroughs rush it back.

Final Quarter

Shortly after the start of the last quarter, coach sent Daugherty, McConnell, and Swanton back into the game to help Baker out. They performed their mission well. In three successive plays Daugherty crashed through tackle for seven yards at a time. McConnell then tore around right end for ten yards. Swanton then furnished perfect interference for Baker, who galloped fifteen yards around left.

Then on a perfect criss-cross Daugherty was off around right end, so it seemed, for a touchdown. The ball, however, was knocked out of his hands and Art Kress fell on it across the goal line. "Moon" Stipe again kicked goal.

Deerfield's last touchdown came as a result of line plunges by Swanton and McConnell and end runs by Baker and Daugherty. Finally Daugherty plunged over from the four yard line.

Trick Fails

New Trier, on a trick play, very nearly caught Deerfield napping near the end of the game. They lined up in open formation drawing the Deerfield linemen with them. Paletti then acted as though the center had mixed his signals and walked forward as if to talk to him. As he came up the ball was snapped and he was off like a shot, but New Trier was penalized for backfield motion. Final score Deerfield 20, New Trier 0.

ness men, requesting the city council to change the detour routing Illinois 42 through this city during construction work at Glencoe and on North Sheridan road bridges. On motion of Commissioner Gourley the petition was referred to the commissioner of streets and public improvements for investigation and report.

On motion of Commissioner Card action on the application of F. G. Dennis to have property at the corner of Green Bay road and County Line road zoned as local business district was deferred one week.

Commissioner Reay moved that the application of T. H. Decker for the

zoning of Lot 8, Block 22, as local business district be referred to the zoning commission.

For New Sidewalks

On motion of Commissioner Card an ordinance was passed providing for construction of a concrete sidewalk on the north side of Lambert Tree avenue, in front of lots 41 and 43, Ravinia Woods subdivision, and lots 3, 4 and 5, Coolidge's subdivision of lots 33 and 34 in Ravinia Woods subdivision.

Commissioner Reay moved passage of an ordinance providing for construction of a concrete sidewalk on the north side of Sheridan road in front of lots 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 25, 26, 27 and 38 Lakeside Manor subdivision.

Board Meets

The council at this point took recess and met as the Board of Local Improvements, during which, on motion of Member Reay a resolution was adopted to adhere to the original plan to pave an alley in block 5, Original Town of Highland Park, from the south line, extended of Laurel avenue to the north edge of the existing pavement in Walnut avenue, also including tile pipe storm drains constructed in Walnut avenue in the present easement across lot 5, block 51, Southwick's resubdivision in Deerfield avenue and in the right of way of the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad Co., and authorizing the corporation council to draft an ordinance, and that the

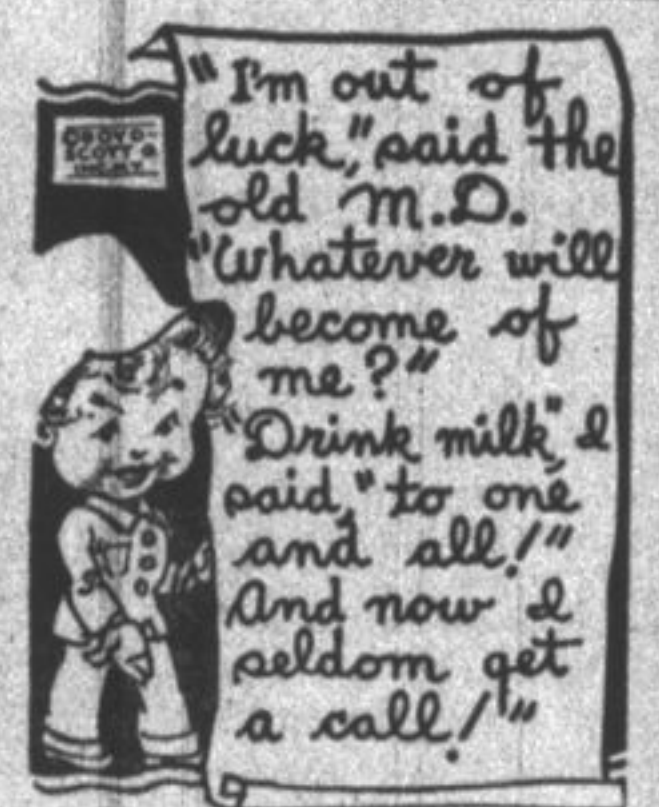
