An ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE BORROWING OF MONEY AND THE ISSUING OF \$25,000.00 SEWER BONDS FOR THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AND PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION OF A DIRECT ANNUAL TAX FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS.

VHEREAS, certain existing sewers, drains, and culverts in the City of Highland Park are inadequate to take care of the sewage and flow of drainage for which they were designed, and certain existing sewers, drains, and culverts are broken and are so out of repair that they cannot now serve first day of December, 1926. the purpose for which they were installed; and

VHEREAS, the City of Highland Park has found that it is necessary for the best interests of the City that said existing sewers, drains, and ATTEST: culverts be repaired, enlarged, and improved, and that such repairs, enlargements, and improvements will cost in excess of the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00); and
