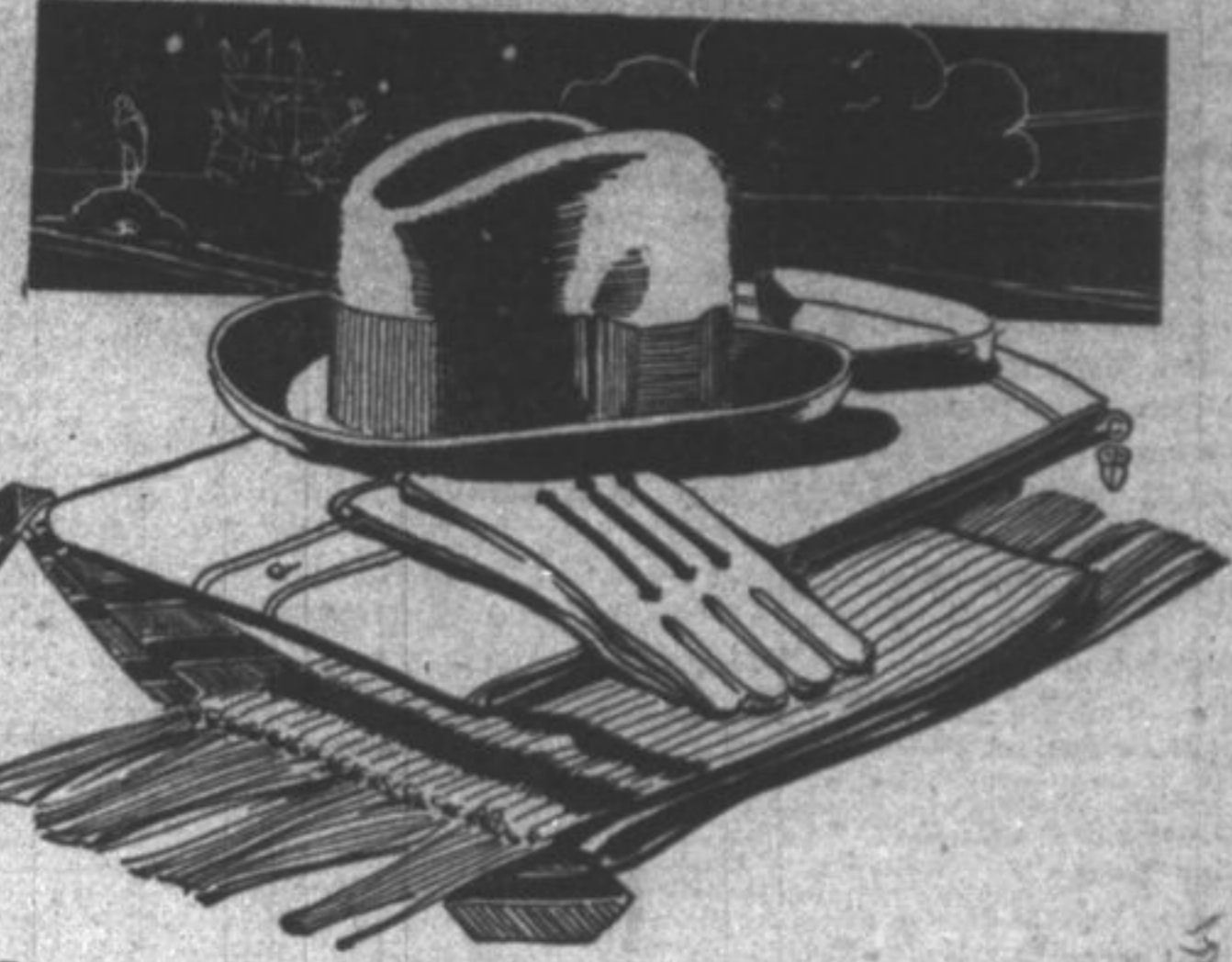

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE BORROWING OF MONEY AND THE ISSUING OF \$25,000.00 SEWER BONDS FOR THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS...

WHEREAS, certain existing sewers, drains, and culverts in the City of Highland Park are inadequate to take care of the sewage and flow of drainage for which they were designed...

WHEREAS, the City of Highland Park has found that it is necessary for the best interests of the City that said existing sewers, drains, and culverts be repaired, enlarged, and improved...

WHEREAS, the City has insufficient funds to pay for such repairs and improvements, and it is necessary for the best interests of the City that it borrow money and issue bonds for said purpose...

SECTION 1. That there be borrowed by and for and on behalf of the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, the sum of \$25,000.00 for the purpose of repairing, enlarging, and improving existing sewers, drains, and culverts in the City of Highland Park...

Said bonds shall bear interest from the date thereof until paid at the rate of four and one-half per cent (4 1/2%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of June and December in each year...

SECTION 2. That each of said bonds and each of the interest coupons be thereto attached shall be in substantially the following forms:

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, STATE OF ILLINOIS, COUNTY OF LAKE, CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, SEWER BONDS, \$1,000.00

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That the City of Highland Park, in the County of Lake and State of Illinois, acknowledges itself to owe and for value received hereby promises to pay to bearer, or if this bond be registered, then to the registered holder hereof, the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) on the first day of December, 1926...

This bond is issued by said City for the purpose of paying the cost of repairing, enlarging, and improving existing sewers, drains, and culverts in the City of Highland Park, pursuant to and in all respects in compliance with an Act entitled, "An Act to provide for the incorporation of Cities and Villages," approved April 10, 1872...

And it is hereby certified and recited that it appears from the records of said City that all acts, conditions, and things required by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Illinois to exist or to be done precedent...

to and in the issuance of this bond have existed, and have been properly done, happened, and been performed in regular and due form and time as required by law; that the indebtedness of said City, including this bond, does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitation...

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the said City of Highland Park, by its Mayor and Council, has caused its corporate seal to be hereto affixed, and this bond to be signed by its Mayor and attested by its City Clerk...

SECTION 3. That for the purpose of providing the funds required to pay the interest on said bonds promptly when and as the same falls due, and to pay and discharge the principal thereof at maturity...

For the year 1926, a tax sufficient to produce the sum of \$1,687.50 for interest and principal; For the year 1927, a tax sufficient to produce the sum of \$6,012.50 for interest and principal...

That interest and principal coming due at any time when there are insufficient funds on hand to pay the same be paid promptly when due from current funds on hand in advancement of the collection of taxes...

That forthwith upon approval of this ordinance by the voters of said City a copy hereof, certified by the City Clerk, which certificate shall recite that this ordinance has been passed by the Mayor and Council of said City, published and approved by a majority of the voters of said City...

SECTION 4. That all ordinances, resolutions, and orders or parts thereof in conflict herewith by and the same are hereby repealed.

FIRST PRECINCT shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: All that portion of the City of Highland Park which lies west of the center line of the right of way (of the east Division) of The Chicago & North Western Railway Company...

SECOND PRECINCT shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: All that portion of the City of Highland Park, which lies west of the center line of the right of way (of the east Division) of the Chicago & North Western Railway Company...

THIRD PRECINCT shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: All that portion of the City of Highland Park which lies east of the center line of the right of way (of the east Division) of the Chicago & North Western Railway Company...

FOURTH PRECINCT shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: All that portion of the City of Highland Park which lies east of the center line of the right of way (of the east Division) of the Chicago & North Western Railway Company...

FIFTH PRECINCT shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: All that portion of the City of Highland Park which lies east of the center line (of the east Division) of the right of way of the Chicago & Northwestern Railway Company...

SIXTH PRECINCT shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: All of that portion of said City of Highland Park which lies east of the center line (of the east Division) of the right of way of the Chicago & North Western Railway Company...

SEVENTH PRECINCT shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit: Beginning at the East Quarter corner of Section 9, Township 48 North, Range 12, East of Third Principal Meridian; thence West on the East and West Quarter line of aforesaid Section 9 and on the east and West Quarter line of Section 8, Township and Range aforesaid, to the center of aforesaid Section 8; thence South on the North and South Quarter line of aforesaid Section 17, Township and Range aforesaid, to the center of Section 17; thence East on the East and West Quarter line of aforesaid Section 17 to the Northeast corner of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of aforesaid Section 17; thence South on the Quarter line of the Southeast Quarter of aforesaid Section 17 to the Southeast corner of the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of the aforesaid Section 17; thence East on the South line of aforesaid Section 17 to the corner of Sections 17-16-21-20, Township and Range aforesaid; thence South on the west line of Section 21, Township and Range aforesaid, to the Southwest corner of aforesaid Section 21; thence East on the South line of Section 21 aforesaid to the Southeast corner of said Section 21; thence north on the East line of Sections 21, 16, and 9, Township and Range aforesaid, to the place of beginning; all in Lake County, Illinois.

The following places have been, by the said Council of the City of Highland Park, designated places of election in and for said Precincts: FIRST PRECINCT:—City Hall, 549 Central Avenue. FIFTH PRECINCT:—Illinois Bell Telephone Co. building, 21 South St. Johns Avenue. SIXTH PRECINCT:—Mrs. Fred Lindholm's residence, 1453 Judson Avenue. SEVENTH PRECINCT:—Arthur Dunas' real estate office, Cloverdale Avenue and West Park Avenue.
