## WELFARE WORK OF

FOR CHILDREN'S BENEFIT

Co-operation With All Approved **Private and Public Agencies** Assured; Methods Used In Aiding

In the early years following the World war, welfare officers of the American Legion frequently contracted cases of disabled men involving dent children. These conditions resulted in the adoption to investigate the feasibility of establishing and maintaining a national home for destitute and orphaned children of legionnaires. A years study was given to the problem. Leading experts in child care throughout the country were consulted. A digest of the program arranged follows.

1. The Legion pledged co-operation with all approved public and private agencies engaged in child work.

5. Modern regional homes built on the cottage plan are to be established as needed and to be used as clearing houses for temporary care of children and for problem children until such time as more suitable arrangements can be made.

For the completion of this work 97 acres and three cottages are located at Otter, Michigan. 388 acres and \$100,000 are invested in Independence, Kansas. Various other billets have been located thru out the United States, our own Illinois being located at Normal.
