

**YOUNGSTERS START FIRE
GARAGE IS BURNED**

Children Playing With Matches Cause of Blaze Tuesday; Other Fires

Fire caused by children playing with matches destroyed a garage on the property of John C. Fay, 700 Central avenue, on Tuesday forenoon. The damage is about \$135. The fire department was called and soon had the blaze out before it could endanger houses adjoining. Two small children had been playing about the garage and when they became cold one of them got some matches and they proceeded to build a fire on the wooden floor of the garage. It is understood the fire spread rapidly and before it could be extinguished the building was practically ruined. The children escaped unharmed.

On Sunday afternoon two grass fires on Ridge road kept the firemen busy for some time. The flames spread rapidly among the dead weeds and at times threatened nearby buildings, but the firemen working hard managed to prevent the fire reaching any of the barns and other structures menaced.

On Sunday night a false alarm called the firemen to the North Western railroad station at Ravinia, but they found no fire.
