MRS. DAWES SPEAKS ON PHILOSOPHY OF PEACE

A regular meeting of the Highland Park Woman's club was held on Tuesday, Jan. 4. Mrs. Rufus C. Dawes, chairman of the International Relations committee of the General Federation of Women's clubs spoke on the Philosophy of Peace.

Mrs. Dawes gave a very sane and well thought out exposition of her subject that would be splendid for every woman to hear and think carefully about. She chose her subject from a recent magazine article in which President Coolidge had said, "Before the fact we must have the philosophy of peace."

She then went back into history to explain that before the fact of Christopher Columbus' discovery of America there had been the philosophy and discussion of the world being round and exploration for years and years, the same way with the art of flying. The fact of the bird flying had to be studied a very long time before the fact of flying was discovered.

The same way with Peace—the fact cannot be consummated until people understand the philosophy of it—they must become intelligent on international relations—the reasons that bring about misunderstandings between nations and finally war. Two very important ones are, interference of raw materials and over population, that is, crowded conditions in one country and not enough food and seeing another country having plenty of land and of food arouses a sense of injustice.

When the majority of people understand these reasons of economics and elect the right kind of leaders, then, Mrs. Dawes said, we will have learned through the philosophy to attain the fact of Peace.

The next meeting of the Woman's club is to be on January 18 at 8 p. m. and is the only evening meeting and an open meeting when the public is invited.

Mr. Max Mason, president of the University of Chicago is to be the lecturer, and his subject is "Substitutes for Experience."

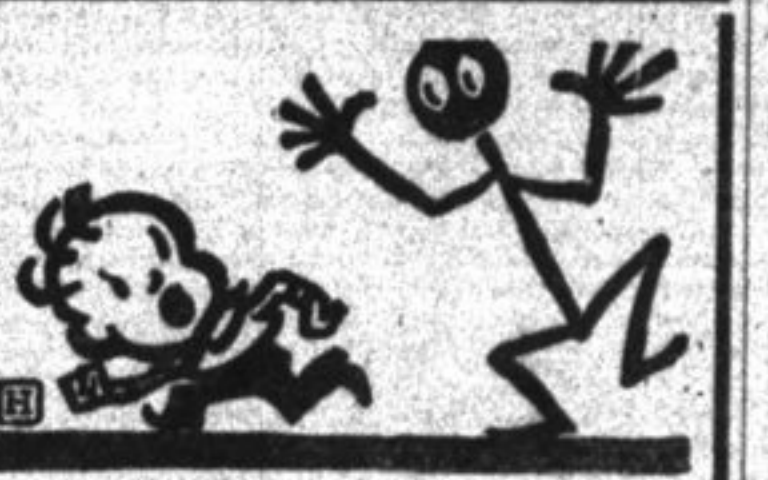
