Deerfield-Shields high school basketball teams will meet University high school quintets in the Deerfield-Shields gym on Friday night, and on Saturday the local teams go to DesPlaines to battle the strong Maine high team. On Tuesday night of next week the locals will play Waukegan high at Waukegan.

Deerfield opened its Suburban League cage schedule last Friday night by trouncing Blue Island in both ends of a double bill. The invading lights were defeated in a thrilling 23 to 21 battle, while the home heavies walked over the visitors by a 27 to 5 count.

The victory, however, was made possible by the excellent work of Bill Joyce who dropped in five field goals. Frank Zanier caged three baskets, while Mills, subbing for Captain Baker, scored twice. The Blue Island heavies were a weak outfit and the home boys encountered little difficulty. The losers scored only two baskets, the score at half time being 18 to 0. Lindenmeyer as usual, led the scoring with five baskets while Johnson counted four and Baker two.
