### NORTH SHORE TOWNS HAVE SPECIAL DAY

At Third Annual Exhibit of  
 Indiana Artists; It Will  
 Be Feb. 4th

North Shore villages have been given a special day for the third annual exhibit by more than one hundred Indiana artists and sculptors, the "Hoosier Salon," which opens January 31 and continues until February 12, at the galleries of Marshall Field and company. The North Shore day will be Friday, Feb. 4. There will be a tour of the galleries at 11 a. m. conducted by Lucie Hartrath, who will talk about the Hoosier artists, who have become as famous as have Indiana authors. The hostesses for the day will be Mrs. William A. Kendrick and Mrs. E. H. Freeman of Wilmette, assisted by other north shore members of the Daughters of Indiana and patrons of the Hoosier Salon.

Among the paintings to be exhibited this year are several which were made in the sand dune country of northern Indiana. Most north shore residents are familiar with this beautiful spot.

Various colleges of Indiana are to have special days also. On the final day of the exhibit, February 12, alumni of Butler, Earlham and Franklin colleges are to have their opportunity for meeting old friends.

The Hoosier Salon is an outgrowth of a desire expressed three years ago by members of the Daughters of Indiana, which has many members in north shore towns, to display the work of the artists of their native state. The members of the Indiana society of Chicago have ably assisted in this work.

### DENIES PETITION TO VACATE ESSEX STREET

Winnetka Council Turns Down  
 Request of New Trier  
 School Board

The petition of the New Trier Township high school board for the vacation of that part of Essex road east of the school plant was denied by the Winnetka village council last week and the matter placed in the hands of the street, drainage and forestry committee of the council, New Trier high school authorities and a committee from the Indian Hill Improvement association to work out some satisfactory method of traffic control over that thoroughfare.

Frederick E. Clerk, superintendent of New Trier high school, addressed the council, explaining the reason for the necessity of safeguarding the Essex road traffic. It is because of the passing of students back and forth between the new gymnasium on the west side of that street and the athletic field which will be located on the east side of Essex road.

The Indian Hill Improvement association was represented by C. T. Davis, who spoke in opposition to the proposed vacation of the street, but expressed the willingness of the association to appoint a committee to confer with the high school authorities and the village.

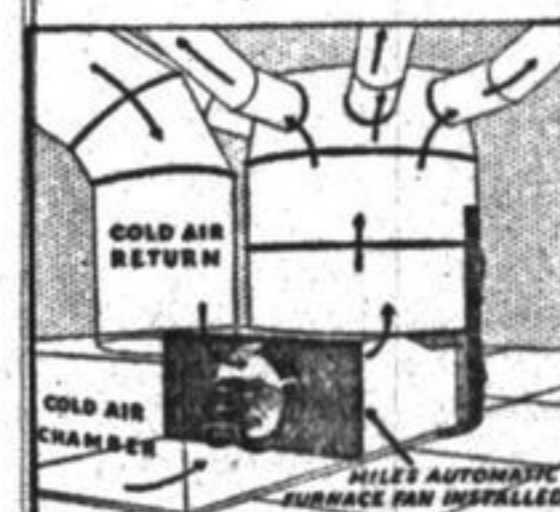
