

CAUSE OF ACCIDENTS HAS BEEN REMOVED

Condition of Temporary Sidewalk Remedied; Two Hurt Are Improving

Injury of two persons recently in falls in front of the new McKillip building, Central avenue, has called attention to the condition of the wooden sidewalk constructed by the contractor to facilitate traffic while the improvement is in progress.

It appears, from the explanation of those interested, that the wooden walk was built with every effort to provide for the elements of safety, but it so happened that as the work was done in the day time, the fact that the east end of the walk, slightly raised from the level of the permanent sidewalk, was right in the shadow of a tree, which obstructs the light from a street lamp.

As soon as the facts were ascertained regarding this condition provisions for remedying it were at once taken and the raise was filled up to the edge of the wooden walk. The contractor carries liability insurance and Mr. McKillip gives assurance that the injured persons are receiving due attention.
