PLAN INSTITUTE OF GOVERNMENT SHORTLY

Northwestern University and Women Voters League to Co-Operate

The campus of Northwestern university is again to be the scene of a statewide educational enterprise. For the second time the University is co-operating with the Illinois League of Women Voters, a school of citizenship having been held in 1923. This year the co-operation will take the form of an institute of government, to be held March 2, 3, and 4, in Harris hall. This is the first time such an institute has been held in Evanston, though similar courses have been conducted at Columbia university, the University of Michigan, the University of Chicago, the University of Illi-

nois, and the University of California. The work of the institute has been arranged in four courses, the first, on the federal constitution, to be presented by Professor Kenneth Colegrove, the second, on Public Welfare in Government, will be addressed by Professor William Bailey and Dr. A. J. Todd, the third, on Election Laws of Illinois will include a lecture by Professor Albert Ellingwood, and the fourth, concerned with International Relations, will be addressed by Dr. Frank Whitmore and Dr. Isaac Cox.

PLAN TO TAKE CURVE OUT OF GLENVIEW ROAD At Intersection With Waukegan Road; Building Bisected, Other Plans

When road improvement plans now underway at the intersection of Glenview and Waukegan roads are completed, motorists west bound from Wilmette to Milwaukee avenue, may proceed directly west through Glenview without being compelled to make the short left hand turn and right hand turn at Waukegan road. Glenview road is to be extended straight through westward at a point where it now enters Waukegan road. A new bridge will span the river to make this new connection and the present bridge on Waukegan road, a short distance south of where Glenview road enters Waukegan road is to be rebuilt and made much wider, it is said. Waukegan road also is to be made wider at this point. The old Blue Heron road house building which stood on the west side of Waukegan road, directly in front of the intersection and which has been purchased by Charles F. Speed, of the Evanston street railway company, has been cut in two, and one-half of the building moved to the north and the other half to the south side of what will be the extended portion of Glenview road. These two buildings Mr. Speed is converting into store spaces.
