AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING THE LEASING, TRANSFERRING, PUTTING INTO CIRCULATION, AND EXHIBITION OF MOVING PICTURES IN THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS.
Be It Ordained by the Council of the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois:

SECTION 1. PERMIT REQUIRED TO EXHIBIT MOVING PICTURES. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to show or exhibit in a public place, or in a place where the public is admitted, anywhere in the City of Highland Park any picture or series of pictures of the classes or kinds commonly shown in museums, kinetoscopes, cinematographs, and such pictures or series of pictures as are commonly shown or exhibited in so-called penny arcades, and in all other automatic or moving picture devices, whether an admission fee is charged or not, without first having secured a permit therefor from the Chief of Police.

SECTION 2. APPLICATION FOR PERMIT. Before any such permit is granted, an application shall be made therefor, and the plates, films, rolls, or other like apparatus by or from which such picture or series of pictures are shown or produced, or the picture or series of pictures as intended to be shown or exhibited, shall be shown to the Chief of Police, or other person appointed by the Council who shall inspect such plates, films, rolls, or apparatus, or such picture or series of pictures, and within three days after such inspection he shall either grant or deny the permit. In case a permit is granted it shall be in writing and in such form as the Chief of Police may prescribe.

SECTION 3. IMMORAL PICTURES—PERMIT NOT TO BE GRANTED. If a picture or series of pictures for the showing or exhibition of which an application for a permit is made is immoral or salacious or teaches false ethical standards or contains improper dress, prolonged passionate scenes, or scenes making crime, drunkenness, or the use of narcotics attractive, or depicts the commission of crime, the white slave traffic, or resistance to police authority, or contains scenes that are unduly horrible, it shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to refuse such permit; otherwise it shall be his duty to grant such permit.

In case the Chief of Police shall refuse to grant a permit as hereinbefore provided, the applicant for same may appeal to the Mayor; such appeal shall be presented in the same manner as the original application to the Chief of Police. The action of the Mayor on any application for a permit shall be final.

SECTION 4. NO TRANSFER OF OBJECTIONABLE FILMS—CONFISCATION-PENALTY. In case a permit shall be refused for any such moving picture plates, films, rolls, or other like articles or apparatus from which a series of pictures for public exhibition can be produced, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to lease or transfer the same to any exhibitor of moving pictures, or otherwise put same into circulation for purposes of exhibition within the city.

In every case where such objectionable moving picture plates, films, rolls, or other like articles or apparatus from which a series of pictures for public exhibition can be produced shall be put into circulation contrary to the provisions of this section, the same shall be confiscated, and in addition thereto the person, firm, or corporation so leasing, transferring, or putting the same into circulation shall be fined not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Two

Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense.

SECTION 5. CUT-OUTS—RETAINED BY CHIEF OF POLICE. Whenever the Chief of Police shall order any cut-out or cut-outs from a reel or series of pictures, the applicant for a permit shall immediately deliver such cut-out or cut-outs to said Chief of Police, and such cut-out or cut-outs shall be forthwith impounded by said Chief of Police and kept at the Police Department until after the exhibition for which such permit is requested shall have been completed and such permit surrendered; and it shall be the duty of said Chief of Police to refuse such permit until such cut-out or cut-outs shall have been so delivered to said Chief of Police.

SECTION 6. FEE FOR PERMIT. The permit herein provided for shall be obtained for each and every reel or any picture or series of pictures exhibited, and shall be required in addition to any license or other imposition now required by law or ordinance. The fee for the permit in each case shall be Twenty-Five Cents (25c) for each reel, which fee shall be paid to the City Collector before the permit or permits are issued. Such permit shall be granted only after the motion picture film for which said permit is requested has been passed by the Chief of Police.

SECTION 7. NOTICE OF TRANSFER OR LEASE-DELIVERY OF PERMIT. When a permit to show a picture or series of pictures is once granted to an exhibitor, the picture or series of pictures may be shown by any other exhibitor; provided, that the written permit is actually delivered to such other exhibitor and that a written notice of the transfer or lease to such other exhibitor is first duly mailed by the transferee or lessee to the Chief of Police. Any number of transfers or leases of the same picture or series of pictures may be made, provided always that the permit is actually delivered to the transferee or lessee, and that such written notice be first mailed to the Chief of Police. Said written notice shall contain the name and a brief description of the picture or series of pictures, the number of the permit, and the location of the building or place where the transferee or lessee proposes to exhibit such picture or series of pictures. The exhibition by the transferee or lessee of any permitted picture or series of pictures, without first mailing such notice, shall be considered a violation of this section, and a separate offense shall be regarded as having been committed for each exhibition by a transferee or lessee of each picture or series of pictures, without the mailing of such notice.

SECTION 8. POSTING OF PERMIT. The written permit herein provided for shall be posted at or near the entrance of the theatre, hall, room, or place where any permitted picture or series of pictures is being exhibited, at such a place and in such a position that it may easily and readily be read by any person entering such theatre, hall, room, or place at any time when any such permitted picture or series of pictures is being exhibited, whether in the daytime or in the nighttime. The exhibition of any such permitted picture or series of pictures without the posting of the permit as herein provided shall be considered a violation of this section, and a separate and distinct offense shall be regarded as having been committed for each exhibition of any such permitted picture or series of pictures without the posting of the permit as herein provided.

SECTION 9. POSTING OF CUT-OUTS UNLAWFUL. Whenever the Chief of Police shall order any cut-out or cut-outs from a reel or series of pictures, it shall thereafter be unlawful for any exhibitor to depict such scene or scenes so cut out, either in front of or within the theatre or place at which said picture or series of pictures is shown, by a poster or other printed or written advertisement.

SECTION 10. PENALTY. Any person violating or neglecting to comply with any provision of this ordinance, where no other penalty is provided, shall be fined not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense. A separate and distinct offense shall be regarded as having been committed for each exhibition of each picture or series of pictures without a permit.

SECTION 11. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 12. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval and due publication.
