FURTHER PLANS FOR

The Branches from Three-State Route; Lake County to Get at Least One

Ten super highway ribs from the circling 150 miles around Chicago proposed thre state super-highways from Milwaukee to Michigan City, are planned to prepare Chicago for the traffic needs of a city of 12,000,-The new roads will cost more than \$50,000,000.

Details of this vast project are being worked out by engineers of the council chamber. Not only will all Chicago Regional Planning Associ-

New routes toward Gary and Hammond and the southern end of Lake Michigan, northwest, west and southwest, will be developed later.

Virtually 100 per cent civic cooperation in dedicating free 200-foot rights of way is being given.

He says Lake county will be anable to take action in regard to getting rights of way until after Cook county and the Wisconsin routes are determined.


