

**BANDED DUCK HAS LONG LIFE RECORD**  
**Marked in 1914 in Utah and Captured in California in October, 1926**

A world record for longevity of a banded bird has been received by the Biological survey of the United States Department of Agriculture. A pin-tail duck, banded by a member of the bureau's scientific staff at the mouth of Bear River, Utah, on September 16, 1914, was captured near Brawley, Calif., on October 16, 1926. The longest previous record of a banded bird's life was that of a white stork that carried a band of the Rossitten Bird Observatory, in Germany, for 11 years. The recovery of banded birds, says the Biological survey, not only furnishes exact information of this kind but also throws light on the remarkable distances traveled by various species of birds and on the routes followed by migratory birds as they seek warmer climates for wintering or fly north to their breeding grounds. Last year about 3,300 returned bands were received, and since 1920 more than 11,000 have reached the bureau and have been used as the basis for entering data concerning various birds.

**AN ORDINANCE CREATING AND DEFINING ELECTION PRECINCTS IN THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT, COUNTY OF LAKE AND STATE OF ILLINOIS: SECTION 1. That the Highland Park East Park District and the territory embraced within its limits be

and the same is hereby divided into three (3) election precincts and the same are hereby fixed as hereinafter provided, that is to say:

The First Precinct shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit:—All that portion of Highland Park East Park District which lies west of the center line of the easterly right of way of the Chicago & Northwestern Railway Company and North of the North line of Sections 33-34-35-36, Township 43 N. Range 12 E. except that portion of the Subdivision known as the First Addition to Ravinia Highlands, Highland Park, Illinois, lying North of the North line of Section 36, Township 43 N. Range 12 E.

The Second Precinct shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit:—All that portion of the Highland Park East Park District which lies East of the center line of the easterly right of way of the Chicago & Northwestern Railway Company and northwesterly of the center line of Beech street, in said Highland Park East Park District.

The Third Precinct shall consist of all the territory and area embraced within the following boundaries, to-wit:—All that portion of Highland Park East Park District which lies

east of the center line of the easterly right of way of the Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company and including that portion of the Subdivision known as the First Addition to Ravinia Highlands, Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, lying North of the North line of Section 36 Township 43 N. Range 12 E.

SECTION 2. All Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.  
SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after

its passage.

**AN ORDINANCE CALLING AN ELECTION FOR TWO COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT, COUNTY OF LAKE AND STATE OF ILLINOIS.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT, COUNTY OF LAKE AND STATE OF ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. That the bi-annual election of the Highland Park East Park District be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in the Highland Park East Park District, in the County of Lake and State of Illi-

nois, on Tuesday, the Fifth (5th), day of April, A. D. 1927, between the hours of seven (7) o'clock in the morning and five (5) o'clock in the afternoon of said day, for the purpose of electing the following officers of the said Highland Park East Park District, to-wit:—

One Commissioner for the full term of six (6) years.

One Commissioner for the short term of two (2) years to fill vacancy.

SECTION 2. That each of the election precincts of said Highland Park East Park District as described and/or created in and by an ordinance entitled: "An Ordinance Creating and Defining Election Precincts in the Highland Park East Park District," passed 23rd day of February, 1927, and approved 23rd day of February, 1927, be and they are hereby declared and created election districts or precincts for the purpose of said election. THAT the polling place for said election in the First Election Precinct shall be the City Hall, 549 Central Avenue; that the polling place for said election in the Sec-

ond Election Precinct shall be H. M. Prior & Company's Office, 27 N. Sheridan Road; that the polling place for said election in the Third Election Precinct shall be the plumbing shop of Arnold Peterson, at 385 Roger Williams Ave., all in the said Highland Park East Park District.
