NEAR EAST RELIEF IN ANNUAL REPORT

LARGE DEFICIT IS SHOWN

Total Amount Expended Exceeds Three Millions; National Trustees and Other Information

A deficit of \$80,000 was shown by the Near East Relief on total relief operations last year of \$3,375,000, according to the report of the treasurer, Cleveland E. Dodge, submitted to the national board of trustees at Their annual meeting in New York this month. This deficit, according to Mr. Dodge, was due to unusual expenditures caused by the Armenian earthquake and the Druse revolt in Syria. Charles V. Vickrey, general secretary of the organization, announced that \$250,000 more was needed for earthquake relief

Trustees Prominent The national trustees of the Near East Relief, 60 in number, include William H. Taft, Josephus Daniels, Charles E. Dawes, Myron T. Herrick, Henry Morgenthau, Elihu Root, John H. Finley, General James G. Harbord, Cardinal Hayes, Bishop Manning, General Leonard Wood and Ray Lyman Wilbur. Three new names were added to this list at the annual meeting,-F. M. Kirby of Wilkes-City, and Arthur Bestor of Chautauqua, N.Y. The officers elected for Finley, editor of the New York Highlands, in Highland Park. Times, vice-chairman; Cleveland E. Dodge of New York, treasurer; and Charles V. Vickrey of Montclair, N J., general secretary.

Barclay Acheson, director of overseas operations, said in his report that the Near East Relief is now conducting the largest non-governmental educational organization in the world, with 18,000 students and 400 teachers enrolled in its overseas erphanage schools, and an additional 40,000 persons in its outside extension work. He added:

"Official records show that the N.a. East Relief has saved nearly 1,500,-000 lives, a large proportion of who a were little children. At the present time 69,700 persons are under its care, of whom 50,500 are children. Only 18,000 of these children however are now in the orphanage schools, the remainder being supported or assisted in homes and in industrial apprenticeships.

Far Reaching Influence "Once an emergency refugee feeding organization, the Near East Relief has now developed into the largest educational organization in the Levant, enrolling 18,000 students and 400 teachers. Even more far-reaching than this direct field of instruction is the foundation that is being laid by means of better text-books and trained teachers for widespread educational work throughout the Near East. Eight standard text books were prepared and published last year, dealing with such practical subjects as gardening, nursing, and hygiene. The direction of this educational task is in charge of Prof. George M. Wilcox, who came to this work after a wide experience in the Philippines. China, and the United States.

Industrial School 'To meet the need for better artisans as well as better citizens in the Near Eastern countries, the organization has established three industrial schools in three widely separated areas-at Syra in Greece, at Antilyas in Syria, and at Leninakan in Russian Armenia. These form the basis for polytechnic institutions with farreaching possibilities throughout the Levant. In addition to these three more highly developed schools, industrial training is given at all the other orphanage centers and specialized work at several of them, such as the rug-making school at Ghazir, and the school for the blind in Syria. Three important nurses' training schools are maintained-in Greece, Constantinople and Armenia."


