MAY DAY TO OPEN ANNUAL MUSIC WEEK

SPECIAL PROGRAMS, PLAN

Observance in Sunday Schools and Elsewhere is Expected; "Message of May" is Feature

Music will serve to illustrate the spiritual aspect on Childhood thru observances in Sunday schools of the coming May Day, which is the opening of National Music Week as well. These observances are to be through the medium of a special program, "The Message of May," a "lyric expression of childhood." This has been prepared in collaboration by the National Music Week committee and the American Child Health association, the latter of which is fostering May Day for child health.

Non-Sectarian
In a foreword to the printed copies of this suggested program the nature of this musical service is thus described: "The sentiments are non-denominational and non-sectarian; the occasion celebrated represents ideals in which all can unite. It is hoped that the participation will be general. Those who desire may combine the program, or any part of it, with their own regular service. The children will undoubtedly sing with greater zeal and will catch added inspiration if they are told that the same words are sung to the same music, and approximately at the same time, by millions of children all over the country—in the great cities and the hamlets—and that they themselves are active participants in national observances fostering two great blessings—music and health—which so deeply affect the happiness of mankind."

Elastic Treatment
A very elastic treatment of the outlined program is suggested not only to the Sunday schools but to other groups that might produce it as an embodiment of their interest in child health. "The Message of May" is divided into four brief motifs, symbolizing various phases of childhood, as follows: "The Child and Nature," "The Child and Its Parents," "Childhood the World Over," and "The Child and God." A spoken prologue and epilogue, to be delivered by an older child or by an adult, develop the respective themes of the four motifs. Each of the latter is expressed through a musical number and these are linked with musical interludes, which are commentaries upon what is to follow. The text, in part, is set to familiar music and has in part a musical setting written expressly for this program. It is suggested that the various episodes be assigned to different groups of children so as to give as many as possible an opportunity for self-expression.

Sample Copies
Sample copies of the printed service are to be distributed by the various national organizations. A specimen copy may also be obtained without charge from the National Music Week Committee, 45 West 45th street, New York City, which is distributing the copies in quantities for use in preparing the actual performance.

HUGE SHIPMENT OF CONFECTIONERY SENT

A special 12-car train carrying 2,618,400 "Baby Ruth candy bars, weighing 400,000 pounds, one of the largest single consignments of confectionery ever shipped will leave Chicago for California and the north Pacific coast over the Chicago and Northwestern, Union Pacific, Southern Pacific railroads, Friday, March 11th.

If placed end to end, the confectionery would make a giant "Baby Ruth" candy bar over 165 miles long. The present shipment, an innovation in the candy business in the United States, is the fifth trainload movement of candy bars manufactured by the Curtiss Candy company of Chicago that has been made in the last several weeks, two already having been moved to Pacific coast points, one to New York City and one to southern points. These five solid trainloads are the first of thirty-two trainload shipments that are being moved by this firm to all parts of the United States within a period of sixty days, comprising the largest movement of confectionery in history.
