IMMIGRATION LAWS AID CITIZENSHIP

PROTECT AND ELEVATE IT
That Is Their Purpose, Says H. E. Hill, Commissioner, In an Article in National Republic

The purpose of our immigration laws is to protect and elevate the standards of American citizenship, declares Harry E. Hill, commissioner of Immigration in an article on the subject in the current issue of the National Republic. Concerning undesirable aliens now in the United States Mr. Hill says:

"There has been a great deal of interest the past year, in fact a public demand, for the removal of aliens unlawfully here, who have either entered without compliance with the laws, or who have become inmates of public institutions after entry, and who should be returned to their countries of origin.

Many Deported
"Let me say in this connection that the past year has been the greatest in immigration history in the number of aliens thus removed on departmental warrant. The rate at which undesirable immigrants were returned to such countries was nearly 1,000 each month.

"Over sixty trans-continental deportation parties were moved, and as a result of carefully perfecting plans these were done at a minimum of expense to the government. To give you a more definite idea of the magnitude of this work, I would say that we have between five and six thousand warrant cases now before the bureau and department of reviews.

Carefully Considered
"When the merits of each are determined by the reviewing officers, deportation warrants will be issued in all those cases in which the law requires that action be taken. Very careful consideration is given to these cases that involve removal from the country of aliens unlawfully here, the bureau and the department's officers spending much time in going over the record to make certain that only those cases are deported that the law requires. The procedure is not a summary one, but is so calculated that when the Secretary of Labor signs the warrant of deportation "due process" shall have been satisfied.

"A large percentage of the aliens now illegally in this country, are the victims of their own carelessness. They came into the country as visitors, tourists, or perhaps floated over the border without proper examination and inspection. They stayed, became allocated to the various industries of the land, and now are a potential part of our better class of people."

WHAT HAS LEAGUE TO DO WITH U. S. ANYHOW?

London Paper Wants to Make Out Our Treaty With Panama Is Incompatible

The signing of a military treaty by the Republic of Panama with the United States, is declared to be incompatible with Panama's membership in the League of Nations, by no less an authority than the London Times.

Possibly true. But if true, there are plenty of precedents. Hardly a day goes by but that some European country does something which is "incompatible" with its membership in the league. If you don't believe this ask Mussolini; he knows. As a matter of fact the league is being converted into a filing place for such little misunderstandings as the big powers desire to be fled away under the caption of "unfinished business." Certainly even the Times will not maintain that the league has acted on any question in which it would feel called on to decide against any of the first class powers of the world.

The fact that European newspapers are calling our treaty with Panama, made to protect a vital national interest, "incompatible" with the spirit of the league, again emphasizing how wise was the course of the United States senate in keeping Uncle Sam out of the league.

EUROPEAN HARES ARE MENACE TO ORCHARDS

A shipment of European hares, consigned to a rod and gun club of West Virginia, recently arrived at the port of New York, but in the absence of a permit from the Department of Agriculture was not allowed to enter the country because the animals were consigned to a point not far distant from important apple-growing districts. In New York, Massachusetts, and Connecticut, where these hares were introduced several years ago, they have caused enormous losses and have proved a serious menace to orchards. The animals in the present shipment were killed and disposed of for market purposes by the importer.
