

**PAY TAXES EARLY
IN APRIL IS PLAN**

COUNTY TREASURER SAYS

**Statement to Be Sent Out As
Soon As Possible; Penalty
Effective Beginning
About May 1**

Taxes can be paid about the first week in April and the first penalty will not be put on property owners until May 1, Treasurer Roy Bracher declared last Friday.

The penalty should go on April 15 but this procedure will not be followed because it has been impossible to start the payment of tax at an early enough date.

The second penalty will fall each thirty days thereafter. The first will be one per cent of the tax and the advertising cost and one per cent in addition each month thereafter.

Devising Methods
The treasurer is trying to devise some convenient method of collecting the tax from citizens on the outside of Waukegan. In the past extra men were allowed but the board cut out this expense during its spasms of retrenchment two years ago.

One method he eyes with favor is designating a bank in each community as a collector. Money can be paid there and a temporary receipt issued. These, upon being sent to the treasurer, would bring a regular county receipt. If the bankers are willing to follow this method the treasurer will adopt it in all possibilities.

He urges that the mails be used in paying the debt. If this plan is followed he urges money orders, cashier's checks or certified checks. If personal checks are sent and it is found that there is no money in the bank it will not work a hardship on the county but on the taxpayer. That is the only reason he does not care to suggest personal checks.

Send Statements Soon

The statements will be sent out as soon as possible. These will be sent to the address of the taxpayer of the previous year. There are about 500 requests in Mr. Bracher's office now for the changing of ownership on descriptions of property. In case persons own property that was paid for someone else a year ago he asks that they notify him as soon as possible so that the changes can be made on the books in order that the statements reach the right party.

**NEW PRESBYTERIAN
CHURCH IS BURNED**

**Libertyville to Have Fine Edifice
in Place of Burned

At a general meeting of the Presbyterian congregation of Libertyville held at the manse last week, plans were completed to insure the success of the campaign to raise \$75,000 for the new church and manse, to be erected on the southeast corner of Maple and Douglas avenues.

The executive committee reported the appointment of a building committee and finance committee, both of which have made excellent progress in their work the past two weeks. Members of the building committee announce that the Colonial type of architecture will be followed in designing the new building.

The present house on the Maple avenue lot is to be set back, facing Douglas avenue, and will be remodeled to form an integral part of the new building.

**Rumors That Lake County Residents
Have Offered Him
Their Homes**

Rumor has it Mrs. Rockefeller McCormick has offered President Coolidge Villa Turicum, her Lake Forest estate, for his proposed western vacation.

Lloyd J. Brown of Evanston, president of the Midway Railway Equipment company, inviting him to accept the use of the Jackson Dering estate near Lake Villa on the Fox Lake-Antioch road, for his vacation this summer.

Mr. Brown in his letter urged the president to spend the summer on the 447 acre estate in Lake county, which he recently purchased from the heirs of Jackson Dering, a wealthy coal merchant who died about a year ago.

The large estate includes a house of fifty rooms, located on Petite and Fox Lakes, and set back from the shores so as to give it a most spacious and luxuriant appearance. It adjoins the estates of Edward and Otto Lehmann.

It is not known as yet whether the leader of the nation and his family will be able to accept either of these reported offers.

**HOUSE PASSES BILL
OFFERED BY WEISS**

A sleepy session of the house suddenly awoke to battle bitterly one day last week at Springfield, when Rep. William Weiss of Waukegan called for passage his measure to increase the salaries of all down-state county superintendents of schools \$600 per annum and to make that of the Cook county school chief \$12,000 per year.

Reps. Schnackenberg, Castle, Tice, Roe and Snell led the attack on the measure; Weiss, Cutler, Waller and others championed the measure.

Rep. Roger Little's motion to recall the bill to amend it by striking out all references to Cook county was tabled 98 to 22, and the debate raged on.

When a vote was taken the house passed the bill 90 to 37.

**SUNDAY SCHOOL MEET
HELD AT LAKE VILLA**

Annual Institute Proves Interesting and Profitable Session; Held Recently

Churchmen from all sections of Lake county gathered in the Methodist church in Lake Villa recently to attend the annual Lake county Sunday School institute. The event was marked by an extensive and interesting program.

Decrease in church attendance in the county and methods to be used in correction formed the basis of discussion for the greater part of the

conference, although the need of developing the Sunday school of the county so that their work will be more efficient and effective in the directing the moral life of the communities in which they are located was stressed.

Addresses were given by R. G. Sands, of Waukegan, president of the association; J. C. Ballentine, of Waukegan, and by Rev. A. M. Krall, of Antioch. Rev. M. Kelvey, of Lake Villa gave the benediction and Rev. N. G. Nye, of Grayslake directed the orchestra.

The rice weevil is best controlled by intelligent use of fumigation during storage, says the Bureau of Entomology of the United States Department of Agriculture. On isolated farms where no control has been instituted for several years, field investigations at the time of harvest have shown as high as 98 per cent of all ears of corn infested with rice weevils. In other fields, well isolated by woodland, or near farm buildings in which the stored corn was properly fumigated, field infestations were less than 1 per cent of the total ears.


