The Continental Divide has been nature's greatest obstacle to the westward progress of man in the United States. But a touch of a key in Washington and an electric current penetrated the formidable range of the Rocky Mountain west of Denver. This means that the tunnel when completed by the Colorado Tunnel commission will furnish an almost direct railroad line between Denver and Salt Lake. It will save an elevation of 2,406 feet, and lessen the railroad distance nearly 175 miles between Denver and Salt Lake City.

This is one of the greatest engineering feats of this generation, and the story related in Washington in connection with the participation of the President in the last week's ceremonies chronicles the historic fact that when the key was touched in the White House that a tunnel driller beneath James Peak closed an electric switch and an instant later the big boom that penetrated the Rockies was heard.

**PASSION PLAY IS TRAGEDY OF ALL AGES**

**Opens Season at Playhouse, Chicago for Limited Engagement; Big Success**

A figure, saintly of mien, dignified in bearing and clad in flowing white robes, moved across a hillside. He was the Christ in the Freiburg Passion Play. His approach hushed the audience at the Playhouse theater on Michigan avenue, Chicago, into a silence that never will be felt. His presence was a symbol never before encountered in a playhouse here. It foreshadowed the greatest tragedy in the world's history. As the Man of Sorrows trod the Via Crucis the theater for a time became a temple, illumined by the Light of the World.

Civilization was based on the events depicted in the Passion play of the Life of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, and the fact that it is now being shown to the public is in line with prophecies to be found in the Old Testament.

To give the audience an idea of the temples and grounds which serve as a stage for the performance of the Passion play at Freiburg, motion pictures of the group of concrete constructed buildings, their foregrounds and backgrounds, are shown. Those pictures, coupled with others of the town itself and of many of the citizens as they come and go, bound for work or pleasure, help one to understand the character of the place and its people.

The play adheres closely to the biblical narrative. As for the enactment of the drama, it is what could be expected by a company steeped in the traditions of the work and so trained in all the details of the action that individual and concerted efforts result in a flawless ensemble. For nearly a hundred years members of the Fasnacht family of Freiburg have taken part in the performance. They have been so bred to it that their present representatives, Adolph, who embodies the Christ, and George, who portrays Judas—so merge themselves into their roles that the illusions they create are as startling as they are impressive.

In its entirety the production, supervised by Dmitri Duchowitzki, is a milestone along the way of progressive art in motion pictures, and is produced by Joseph Francis Meyers—it will continue for a limited engagement twice daily, 2:15 and 8:15 at popular prices which are within the reach of everyone.

**LAKE COUNTY QUOTA SOON RAISED, BELIEF**

That Lake county will be over the top so far as enlistments in the 1927 Reserve Officers Training Camps are concerned, was announced at the meeting of the Waukegan committee on preparedness Monday night.

Rev. N. A. Borop, chairman of the Lake county committee, called the meeting because it had been reported that there was not a single Lake county boy signed up to take the training at Fort Sheridan this year. Capt. P. J. Lloyd, commanding officer of the high school R.O.T.C. unit and Capt. B. F. West, however, announced at the meeting that more than thirty boys from the high school were ready to sign up for the summer work. These boys will be given two weeks of intensive military training which will fit them to become commissioned officers in the army in case of another war.

**USE GAS TO HEAT ICE HOUSE, REPORT**

During the past, several gas companies have sold gas heating boilers to coal dealers for keeping homes and offices warm, but a recent case that came to light in New York City describes the sale of gas boiler to an ice company.

The gas company at Tonawanda, New York, has sold a coal company a thermostatically controlled gas-fired boiler for use in heating an ice house. It is necessary for the ice house to have heat to keep the ice blocks from freezing together at extremely low temperatures, making separation of the blocks impossible. The gas boiler will maintain a temperature of approximately 30 degrees in the ice house all the time.
