Nineteen Kinds of Oaks You may be surprised to know there are nineteen different kinds of oaks in Illinois-eight white and eleven black, together with some badly crossed varieties which the botan-

ist calls "hybrid" oaks. There are seven varieties of hickory, six of ash, four each of birch, maple and elm, three locust and two hackberry in Illinois. With such a variety of trees to be found there is wood suitable for all purposes if properly cared for and pains taken to grow another crop-for furniture, railroad ties, farming implements, fence posts and the many other uses which only wood can fill.

There are in the neighborhood of twenty-five varieties of trees cultivated in Illinois until they feel very much at home. Among these are the "Tree of Heaven," the osage orange, the white and black mulberry, the apple tree which is a native of Asia,

Largest Tree in State

In the survey foresters of the Department of Conservation located near Paris, in Edgar county there is believed to be the largest tree in the state of Illinois. This is a burr oak which measures eighteen feet in circumference at the height of a man's chest. The topmost branches of this monarch of the forest tower 108 feet above the earth. It is estimated the tree is more than 275 years old.

### SEEK RELIGIOUS SPIRIT SUPREME

EVIDENCED BY DONATIONS

Will Hays Comments on Drive For Presbyterian Ministers Fund; Campaign Soon to Be Started

Will H. Hays, chairman of the National Campaign being held by the Presbyterian church, U. S. A., to raise a \$15,000,000 pension fund for its old disabled ministers, in a statement reviewing the amount and volume of subscriptions thus far received, today declared that in them and in the response to the church's appeal is found proof that the spirit of Christianity still rises above all theological theories and individual denominational

Mr. Hays terms the causes of Christianity "the greatest of all opportunities for exceptionally generous giving by the very wealthy." His statement was made public through campaign headquarters here for Illinois, in which a campaign for its quota at \$1,507,000 will be held in April and May, under direction of George Woodruff, state chairman simultaneously with campaigns in 13 other states, from Illinois to California, which wind up the national drive. Nearly \$10,000,000 has been pledged in eastern drives. The statement fol-

The volume of small subscriptions is inspirational in showing to the very wealthy the unity that comes in the rank and file when Christianity itself is concerned and suggests that causes, such as this are the greatest of all opportunities for exceptionally generous giving by the very wealthy.

"We have given our contributors five years to pay, and it is worthy to note that our largest subscriptions are on the five year basis. The man of big business sees the business value of such giving.

Memorials Chosen

"Some of our wealthier people already have taken this opportunity to give to this enobling cause by creating memorials to their dead; others have seen in it the moment for setting differences with their church, at the same time bringing to themselves that warmth and glow of satisfaction that always comes from giving help to those in need.

"In these days of constantly changing political, economic and religious theories, it is encouraging to feel that thousands of every-day citizens have delved deeply into their none-too-full pockets to help a religious cause, that their response will inspire the very wealthy to even more generous giving and that all still look upon the office of the ministry as the office of Christ, Himself-an officer that must, and will, be protected to the end, regardless of all else."
