

Urbana has been called the home of the most important manufacturing plant in lilinois. That plant is the University of Illinois. Its raw materials are youth and ambition. product is men and women. Illinois has twenty-nine colleges and universities. Of these the University of Illinois is the largest.

There are now enrolled at the university 13,764 men and women. On the payroll of the university, faculty members and employes of various kinds, are 1,380 more. The university owns sixty-seven important buildings. Their value less than one year ago was fixed at \$9,691,177. The school holds title to 2,431 acres of land. The campus proper consists of 356 acres.

Huge Appropriation The state of Illinois appropriates an average of \$5,250,000 a year to keep the University of Illinois in operation. All of the colleges and schools comprising the university are in Urbana except three. These, the College of Medicine, College of Dentistry and School of Pharmacy are in Chicago.

These are only a few of the practical and valuable results of scientific investigations. A remarkable work is now under way, which will take many years and may never end. It is the breeding of new varieties of apples. To date 27,000 first generation hybrids have been developed and several thousand second-generation

hybrids are in the seedling stage. Eighteen thousand trees, worth saving, are now in the orchards and a check-up shows 427 potential new varieties of apples some of which may be of untold value to orchardists and home-growers.

#### APPRAISES RECORD OF 69TH CONGRESS

Discovery of akaine, a non-habit TELLS OF ACHIEVEMENTS

Chairman of National Republican Congressional Commit-Ttee Describes Its Work; Comments

An Appraisement of the record of the 69th Congress, written expressly for the National Press Service by Congressman Will R. Wood of Indiana, charman Republic National Congressional committeé.

"The Sixty-nine congress, which closed its labors March 4, obeyed the unmistakable mandate of the 1924 election to disregard radical proposals of changes in the fundamental principles of our government, and to continue the major policies of the national Republican administration, loking to the complete rehabilitation of government affairs upon a peacetime basis.

Révenue Act

"In its first session it lost no time in the enactment of a revenue act, which not only reduced taxes in a further amount of nearly four hundred million dollars and released from the federal taxrolls nearly two and one-half millions of American citizens least able to bear a share of the burden, but which embodied principles of tax reform vigorously opposed by the minority party in the preceding congress. The lesson of the 1924 election had not been lost upon the Democrats in congress who joined almost unanimously in the passage of the revenue act, and who found so little to oppose in other administration policies that they went into the 1926 campaign without a single issue to command the attention of the country as a whole.

Debt Funding

"In its first session, also, in addition to the enactment of much other beneficial legislation in keeping with the Republican program, the Sixtyninth Congress gave approval to debt funding agreements with most of our foreign debtors.

"As usual the short session just closed was occupied principally with the passage of the great annual appropriation bills, a task sufficient in inself to tax the energies of a legislative body in the three months allotted, yet it has to its credit the enactment of a measure of far-reaching importance-the Radio Control billand important legislation amending and liberalizing the national banking laws and looking to the continuance of the great Federal Reserve System.

Kept Within Budget "Appropriations of public funds by

the Sixty-ninth Congress were kept well within the budget estimates, and in general it gave effective legislative aid toward the National Republican program of economies in keeping with the needs of a rapidly growing country, and toward the laying of a basis for a further reduction of the tax burden."


