In 1786, the Place du Palais Royal being the center of attraction, the government replaced an old form of sundial by one of the new style muzzle loading cannon with converging lenses. Collecting the sun's rays on passing the meridian, sufficient heat was produced by the lens to fire the cannon exactly at the noon hour.

LAMP TIME-KEEPERS

Interesting Features of Collection Displayed at Art Institute

In the Mrs. William O. Goodman collection of pewter in Gunsaulus Hall, Art Institute, are two lamp time-keepers to measure the hours of the night. On a stand of pewter is mounted a glass oil resevoir, banded with longitudinal strips of the metal, on one of which are cast the hour numerals. From the base of the resevoir a spout extends to receive the wick, which, when alight, illuminates the hour band and resevoir.
