POST OFFICE NEW QUARTERS DECIDED

ARE IN ZEISS BUILDING

Rapidly Increasing Business Demands Larger Quarters; \$1200 New Equipment

Store number three of the Zeiss building on Deerfield avenue has been selected for the new quarters for the Deerfield postoffice and from all indications it will be moved in the near future.

It was with a great deal of pleasure that this announcement was received, not only by the postmaster, but by the entire community inasmuch as the present quarters are most unpleasant and inadequate.

Mr. Meyer, postmaster, has purchased \$1200 worth of new fixtures which combined with the cheerful surroundings of a new building will prove both a delight and credit to the town.

The Deerfield postoffice is a third-class office and with the rapidly increasing business it is well on the way to second class. Last year the sale of stamps amounted to nearly \$7,000.

The rent of the new quarters, however, exceeds the amount allowed by the government but with the co-operation of the village of Deerfield part of it has been rented for a clerk's office. A lease was signed.

EASTERN STAR PLAYS GREATLY ENJOYED

Two Performances Well Attended; Deerfield People Prove Dramatic Talent

PROPOSED CHANGES IN P. T. A. BY-LAWS

AT MEETING THURSDAY

Deerfield Women Assist as Hostesses; Sale of Cakes Adds To Student Aid Fund

The hostesses among the Deerfield members of the Deerfield-Shields High School Parent-Teacher association who served at the May meeting in the English club room last Thursday afternoon were Mesdames John A. Stryker, J. A. Reichelt, Jr., A. R. Warner, Edwin Wood, R. B. Patterson, E. R. Frost, Albert Mitchell, A. J. Johnson, John O'Connor, and Hastings. So generous was the response to the request for cakes that enough were left to be sold for over eight dollars, which was added to the student aid fund. Mrs. Wood and Mrs. Mitchell poured.

Mrs. Paul gave the report of the Quincy conference of the Illinois Council of Parent-Teacher association which she attended as a delegate because of her election to the presidency of the D. S. H. S. P. T. A.

Proposed changes to be made in the constitution and by-laws of the Deerfield-Shields Parent-Teacher association:

Constitution

Article II. Section 2. Now reads as follows:

It is expressly understood that under no circumstances shall the policy or attitude of this association be partisan or political.

Proposed change—Substitute "in political matters" for "or political."
