CITY COUNCIL HAS ADJOURNED SESSION

Continued from page 1 and of the first addition to Sherwood Manor were approved.

A communication was received from the appeal board asking for an appropriation for secretarial work.

Friday Evening's Session

At the regular meeting of the city council on Friday evening of last week considerable business of importance received attention and a number of routine matters were taken care of also.

The communication of J. Cabonargi, requesting permit for construction of a building at First street and Green Bay road, was referred to the appeal board.

The report of Windes & Marsh, engineers, on the request of Phelps & Hayward, covering plans for sanitary sewer in Briargate Villas subdivision was referred to the corporation counsel for report. The request of Braun Bros. Oil Co. for permit to install storage tanks for fuel oil at Blodgett, between tracks of the two railroads, was referred to the zoning committee.

Sidewalk Planned

Commissioner Gourley moved that the corporation counsel be instructed to prepare an ordinance providing for construction of sidewalk on north side of Roger Williams avenue from St. Johns avenue to Judson avenue. The corporation counsel also was instructed to confer with the officials of the village of Deerfield and report on what arrangements could be made with reference to moving the Deerfield watermeter to the west corporate limits of the city of Highland Park before the feeder system of water mains is installed.

C. Carlson was allowed refund on a building permit and the permit was cancelled on recommendation of building inspector, and E. Markowitz was allowed refund and permit cancelled also. Larson Brothers on motion of Commissioner Reay, were granted permit to tap six-inch water main on First street in front of Lot 7, Block 3, with a 6 by 8 tee for purpose of supplying water for a sprinkler system for fire protection only.

Communications

A communication from Attorney Ernest Gail with reference to rebate on Highland Park Special Assessment No. 280 was referred to the corporation counsel. The communication of John Wilhelm with reference to use of a private garage at 510 Lincoln place was referred to the department of public health and safety. On motion of Commissioner Reay the Chicago Children's Benefit league was granted permit for annual tag day Monday, Oct. 10.

Commissioner Gourley moved that Commissioner Brown and Zimmer, together with the building inspector, make investigation of the E. O. Eck matter and report with recommendations to the council. The communication of M. C. Hart and Gregory M. Sheahan with reference to permit for water tap on Elm place was referred to department of public health and safety.

Bills Approved

Commissioner Reay presented bills and payrolls for period from April 15 to May 15, 1927, the bills totaling \$12,000.81. His motion that these be approved and paid prevailed.

The corporation counsel was requested to submit legal opinion as to whether the city could make advances from the general fund to the local improvement account for preliminary expenses.

On motion of Commissioner Zimmer the engineers were directed to make investigation and submit estimate of cost of repairing Bloom street sewer. The commissioner of streets and public improvements and of public health and safety were requested to make investigation of an ordinance passed October 9, 1925, prohibiting erection and maintenance of gasoline pumps in streets and parkways and recommend to the council whether or not the ordinance should be repealed.

Windes & Marsh submitted a report on the request of Eugene Orrio to extend storm water drain across Lot 59, Block 1, First addition to Ravinia Highlands and city clerk was

directed to write Mr. Orrio stating that the city did not feel it could extend this pipe under assessment proceedings No. 310.

On motion of Commissioner Brown Mr. Coolidge was granted permit to install a 4-inch water main on Lambert Tree avenue to supply lots 2, 3, 4 and 5 in Coolidge's subdivision and an 8-inch sanitary sewer to supply Lots 2, 4, and 5 across an easement on Lots 2 and 4, said permit to be granted under the usual conditions and restrictions.

Disconnect Tract

Commissioner Brown moved passage of an ordinance disconnecting the following described territory from the city of Highland Park: That part of the southeast quarter of Section 8 and of the west half of the southwest quarter of Section 9 which lies east of the center line of Ridge road and
