

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARY OF CITY OFFICERS AND CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK, ILLINOIS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HIGHLAND PARK:

SECTION 1. That the salaries of the following City Officers and employees, for the fiscal year beginning May 1st, 1927, and ending April 30th, 1928, be fixed at such sum as is provided for by this Ordinance for such officer or employee for the discharge of the duties of such office, as required under the laws of the State of Illinois, and the ordinances of the City of Highland Park, during the term of his office or employment, and that such officer or employee shall receive no further compensation from the City of Highland Park for the duties of such office during the term thereof.

That the salary of the City Clerk be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$3600.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Corporation Counsel be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$1800.00) per annum plus a percentage of the total cost of each improvement made by special assessment confirmed by Court in accordance with the following schedule:

One per cent (1%) of the total or any part of the cost of each improvement up to \$250,000.00;

Three-fourths of one per cent (3/4%) of the total or any part of the cost of each improvement up to \$350,000.00 in excess of \$250,000.00.

One-half of one per cent (1/2%) of that part of the cost of each improvement in excess of \$350,000.00 and two per cent (2%) of all deficiencies in improvements made by special assessment confirmed by the Court, the cost of which is defrayed by supplemental special assessment.

That the salary of the City Attorney be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1200.00) per annum.

That the salary of the City Treasurer be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$1200.00) per annum.

That the salary of the City Collector be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$3400.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Assistant in the City Collector's office be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Six Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$1680.00) per annum.

That the salary of the City Marshal be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$3200.00) per annum.

That the salary of Police Sergeants Number One, Two and Three be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand Three Hundred Ten Dollars (\$2310.00) per annum.

That the salary of Police Officers Number One, Two and Four be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand One Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$2160.00) per annum.

That the salary of Police Officers Number Three, Five and Six be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$2100.00) per annum.

That the salary of Police Officers Number Seven and Eight be and it is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$1980.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Chief Engineer of the Water Works be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$3200.00) per annum.

That the salary of the First, Second and Third Assistant Engineers at the Waterworks be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand One Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$2160.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Foreman of Streets and Public Improvements be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Chauffeur in the Department of Streets and Public Improvements be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Six Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$1680.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Foreman of Sewer and Water Mains be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2500.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Stenographer in the City Clerk's office be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$1860.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Bookkeeper in the City Clerk's office be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$1800.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Stenographer in the City Collector's office be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Three Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$1320.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Chief Fire Marshal be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$3200.00) per annum.

That the salary of the First Assistant Fire Marshal in charge of the Fire Station (during the day) be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$2700.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Second Assistant Fire Marshal in charge of the Fire Station (during the night) be

and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand One Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$2160.00) per annum.

That the salary of Fireman Number One, Two and Three be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand Forty Dollars (\$2040.00) per annum.

That the salary of Firemen Number Four and Five be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$1800.00) per annum.

That the salary of the General Helper in the Water Department be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Two Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$2200.00) per annum.

That the salary of the man in charge of the Garbage Incinerator Plant be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Six Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$1620.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Building Inspector be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Three Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$3600.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Assistant in the Building Inspector's office be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Nine Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$1920.00) per annum.

That the salary of the President of the Board of Health be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Visiting Nurse be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$1800.00) per annum.

That the salary of the Moving Picture Censor be and the same is hereby fixed at the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$1260.00) per annum.

SECTION 2. That the salaries provided for in Section One of this ordinance shall be due and payable in semi-monthly installments on the First and Fifteenth day of each month for the preceding half month of their services during the term of their office.

SECTION 3. That the salary of the City Clerk, Corporation Counsel, (exclusive of percentage on special assessments for local improvements), Attorney, President of the Board of Health, City Marshal, Police Sergeants, City Police Officers, Stenographer in the City Clerk's office and Visiting Nurse shall be paid from the Salary of Officers Fund provided for in the Department of Public Affairs.

All percentages paid the Corporation Counsel for work on special assessments in local improvements shall be paid out of the respective six per cent (6%) items of such assessments levied for the cost of making, levying and collecting such assessments.

That the salary of the City Treasurer, City Collector, City Collector's Assistant, Stenographer in the City Collector's office and Bookkeeper shall be paid from the Salary of Officers Fund provided for in the Department of Accounts and Finance.

That the salary of the Foreman of Sewer and Water Mains, Chief Engineer at the Water Works, First, Second, and Third Assistants at the Water Works, General Helper in the Water Department, Chief Fire Marshal, Day and Night Firemen at the Fire Station, Firemen Number One, Two, Three, Four and Five, Building Inspector, Assistant in the Building Department and Moving Picture Censor shall be paid from the Salary Fund provided for in the Department of Public Health and Safety.

That the salary of the Foreman of Streets and Public Improvements and the Chauffeur in the Department of Streets and Public Improvements shall be paid from the Salary Fund provided for in the Department of Streets and Public Improvements.

That the salary of the man in charge of the Garbage Incinerator shall be paid from the Garbage Fund.

SECTION 4. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication.

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that the City Council of the City of Highland Park, County of Lake, and State of Illinois having ordered the construction of a connected system of Cast iron water mains in Deerfield Avenue, Ridgeland Avenue, Ellendale Road, Northland Avenue, Garland Avenue, Midland Avenue, Ridgeland Avenue, McCraren Road, Arbor Avenue, Ferndale Avenue, Edgewood Avenue, Glenwood Avenue, Eastwood Avenue, Cloverdale Avenue, Sunnyside Avenue, Ridge Road, the ordinance for the same being on file in the office of the City Clerk of said city and having applied to the County Court of Lake County for an assessment of the costs of said improvement according to benefits, and an assessment thereof having been made and returned to said court, the final hearing thereof will be had on the Twenty-fifth day of June, A. D. 1927, 10 o'clock Daylight Saving Time, or as soon thereafter as the business of the court will permit.

Said assessment is payable in ten (10) installments, with interest at the rate of six (6) per centum per annum on all installments from and after date of issue of first voucher. 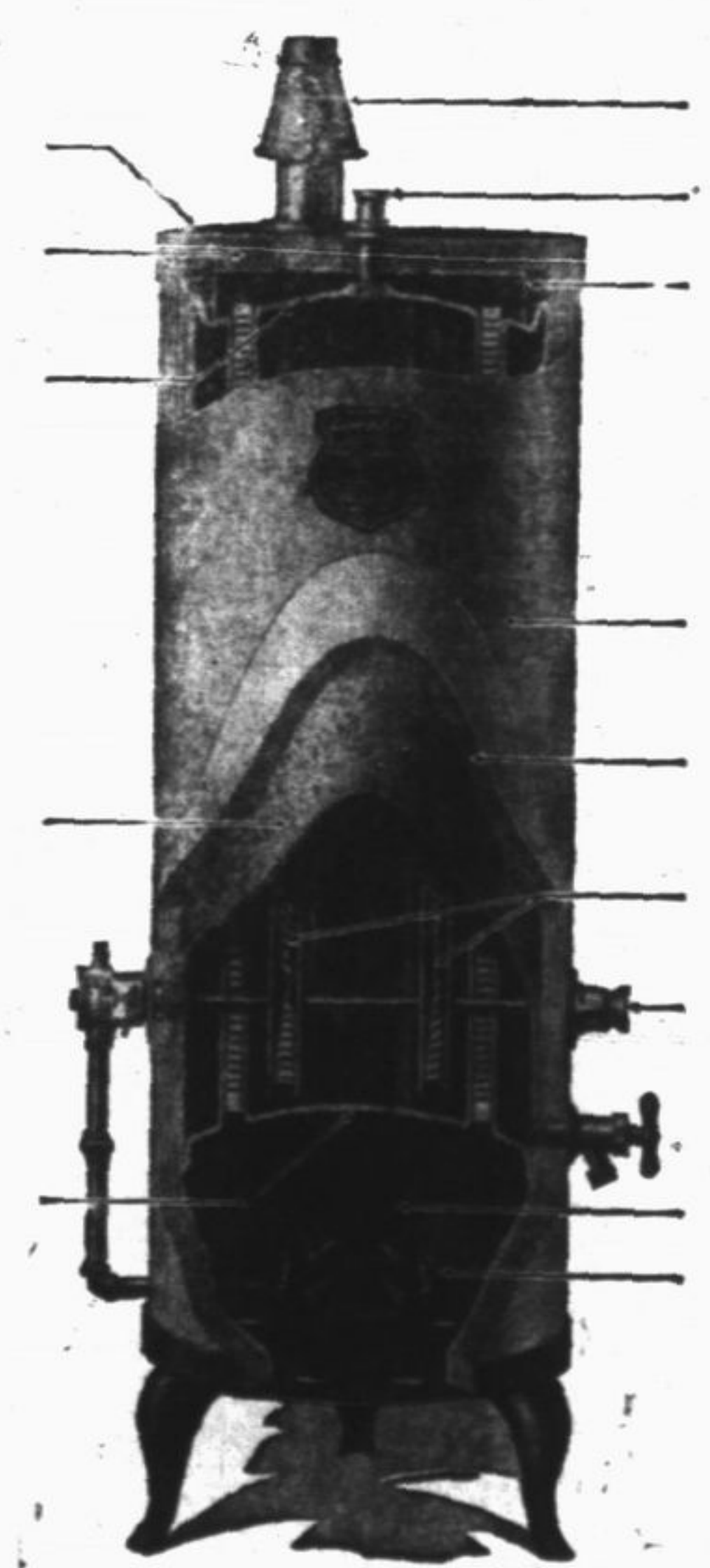
