

LEGISLATION WHICH AFFECTS SPORTSMEN

IN THE ILLINOIS ASSEMBLY

Several Bills Now on Passage of Interest to Those Who Enjoy Hunting, Fishing and the Like

Legislation affecting the more than six hundred thousand sportsmen of Illinois is embraced in four bills now on passage in the General Assembly. House Bills number 744 and 745 combine amendments to the Game Code and Fish Code.

In addition to several merely technical changes in the Game and Fish Codes there is one amendment of vital importance. This provides that if the proposed bond issue for game preserves and public shooting and fishing grounds is approved by the people the revenue from hunting and fishing licenses is to be used to retire the bonds and pay interest so that no direct taxes will be needed.

Senators bill 572 provides for a commission of five members from the Senate and five from the House to study the development and maintenance of game preserves and public shooting and fishing grounds. This bill has passed the Senate and is now before the House.

Surpassing the other three bills in importance to farmers, and the general public, as well as the more than half a million sportsmen is the Stream Pollution Bill, Senate Bill 245. This bill was introduced two years ago but was defeated by certain commercial interests that were apparently unwilling to make any effort towards cleaning up stream pollution.

Introduced again this session by Senator Jewell this bill has passed the Senate by an overwhelming majority. It is now on second reading in the House.

According to one member who is actively in favor of clean streams in Illinois it is now a question not only of game and fish conservation but of protection of the health of the whole people of the state.

NEW RADIO SERVICE FOR FLYING STATIONS

Broadcasting of Weather Report by Government is a Great Help

In place of the special system of extra early weather observations for aviators for which the second deficiency bill carried provision, but which failed to pass, a new radio broadcasting service for air stations has been established since April 18 by the Weather Bureau of the United States Department of Agriculture, in co-operation with the Navy Department.

This service consists of sending out by radio at 8:15 a. m. on three wave lengths the regular weather reports now received by telegraph at 8 a. m. This has been made possible through the Navy Department which furnished the Arlington equipment and several expert operators.

It is sent out by what is called remote control from the Weather Bureau—that is, as the telegraph observations come in, they are immediately transmitted in code on an instrument in the forecaster's office direct to Arlington and onto the air. A receiving set placed in the same room enables the sender to check the accuracy of the reports.

It has not been found practicable as yet to transmit the evening telegraphic weather reports in the same way. The advantage in the morning radio broadcasting is that about an hour and a quarter's time is gained for the benefit of aviators who need information as to upper air conditions as early as they can get it.

Ordinarily it takes until about 9:30 a. m. to assemble and transmit the morning weather reports, and that is the hour changes are made on the weather maps displayed in public places. This time is too late to do fliers any good, but the new service has been found useful. It is within possibility that business interests that are sensitive to weather changes affecting crop conditions—such as cotton exchanges, stock markets, shipping associations, boards of trade, and many others—will find the new service sufficiently valuable to warrant installing receiving sets in order to get this information at the earliest possible hour.
