

SEVERAL AUTOMOBILE ACCIDENTS REPORTED

A Number of Crashes in Which Cars Are Damaged; No One Hurt Badly

A Ford sedan owned by E. J. Brown was badly smashed last week when it was struck by a Buick sedan owned by F. E. Wester of Marquette, Mich. Wester gave Brown a check for \$135, but later at the advice of his attorney, it is presumed, stopped payment on the check until Brown should sign a release from all further responsibility for Wester. At last report Brown, whose leg was slightly injured, had not signed a release.

A Buick sedan owned by John Campbell skidded into a water main ditch on Central avenue Sunday and was somewhat damaged. Mrs. Hayes of Evanston, who was in the car, was taken to the hospital but was later able to be removed to Chicago.

On Monday a truck from Wilmette driven by R. L. Jenkins of that place, struck a Dodge sedan driven by Miss Leaning at the corner of Cedar and Sheridan. The Dodge was driven into a tree and considerably damaged.
