**TOTAL BUSINESS IN  
LIVESTOCK MARKETS**

Of the total business done on the principal livestock markets of the country a considerable amount is now handled through the co-operative commission companies. The percentages vary for different markets, being as low as 1.5 per cent on the Oklahoma City market and as high as 45 per cent on the Evansville, Ind., market. The percentages at Chicago, Buffalo, St. Paul, Omaha, and Kansas City markets are 10 per cent, 17.4 per cent, 30.1 per cent, 8 per cent, and 8.9 per cent, respectively. These markets are among the largest in the country.

The largest summer course for training athletic coaches in the United States is conducted by the University of Illinois.  
Approximately 300,000 hunting licenses are issued in Illinois yearly. Illinois has 1,064 communities served by telephone.

Illinois leads the country in the manufacture of sewing machines.  
Electric power plants in Illinois generated an average of 823.7 kilowatt hours of electricity for each person in the state last year.

With only 31 gas companies within the state, Illinois has 257 communities receiving gas service.  
Illinois produces more scientific and laboratory instruments than any other state in the country.  
The cost of public education in Illinois is \$105.88 per pupil per year.
