FROM GASOLINE TAX PLAN

Estimates For Other Counties In This District Given; Extensive Highway Improvement

A tremendous highway and street improvement program is to go forward immediately in Chicago and its metropolitan area and a contributing cause of the road building boom will be the much-discussed gas tax. Robert Kingery, general manager of the Chicago Regional Planning association, said in a recent interview.

The gasoline tax law, Mr. Kingery says in correcting a "popular impression" to the contrary, provides that the money apportioned to the several counties may be spent on state aid routes and these routes may be paved into a city of any size in

Cook county.

Outside of Cook county, says the planning association officials, the routes may be paved into cities and villages having as high as 75,000 population in the last federal census. Cook county, he estimates, will receive nearly \$2,500,000 annually from the tax; DuPage \$90,000, Grundy \$25,000, Kane \$14,000, Lake \$100,000, pairs. McHenry \$50,000, Will \$110,000, Kendall \$15,000 and Kankakee \$52,000.
