RUN MOTOR COACHES

Regular daily motor coach service between the Chicago Loop and downtown Milwaukee was inaugurated Saturday, Aug. 20, by the Chicago speed operating schedule of three hours and a half between the business centers of the two cities.

Parlor-observation coaches are being used in this new interstate service, to which regular rail ticket rates apply. Connection in either direction with North Shore Line trains is made at Wilson avenue and Dempster street, Niles Center, with transfer privileges at these stations.

This new limited service is the fastest motor coach service

Coaches leave the Auditorium Hotel, Congress street and Michigan boulevard, northbound daily at 8:20 a. m., and 2:20 p. m., standard time, arriving at Milwaukee Terminal at 12 o'clock noon and 6 p. m., respectively. Stops are made at 223 S. Wabash avenue, Wilson avenue, and Dempster street, thence operating without a stop into Milwaukee.


