One shipment of the great bronze sea horses, which are to be installed near the outer rim of the gigantic Buckingham fountain in Grant Park, has arrived in New York and will be in Chicago this week. Two other shipments are due, when the work of installing them will be undertaken. The formal dedication of the fountain will take place on August 26th. This magnificent gift to the city of Chicago is being made by Miss Kate S. Buckingham in memory of her brother Clarence, who was a trustee of the Art Institute and a patron of the arts. The fountain is in a garden about 600 feet square with four minor pools in the subdivisions of this garden. Three fountain basins rising one above the other occupy the center of the main pool, which is about 300 feet across, having four large segmental portions cut by square angles, at one of which is placed a power house and operating stand. The three basins rise one above the other, the lower basin 100 feet in diameter, the intermediate basin 60 feet and the upper basin 24 feet, the total height being about 25 feet from the level of the ground.

There are about 72 jets in the main fountain, all issuing from the pool and being projected toward the center of the fountain, forming a dome like effect. In the center a great column of water rises to a height of from 70 to 80 feet above the level of the top basin, with eight additional jets playing upon the central column. The sea horses, consisting of four pairs of bronze sea monsters each twenty feet long, will project foaming streams of water on a very flat trajectory. At night colored illumination is provided.

In the southern states, flood water along the Mississippi river valley has receded in most sections, and practically all important routes are open for travel. Considerable rainfall was reported in Arkansas and Tennessee but this causes little difficulty to motorists at this time of the year.

Rainfall in the central plains states and southwest causes practically no trouble at this time of the year. All improved and important unimproved trails are now in excellent condition through all the western states.

The fountain is the work of Parsons, Bennett & Frost, and J. H. Lambert associate architect. Mr. Bennett says: "The scope of this scheme is more ample than any that has been projected anywhere in modern times or in the past in any one single fountain. It may be likened to some extent to the superb fountain of Latona in the garden of Versailles, although its dimensions are more than twice as large and the flow of water three or four times as ample. It is a tradition that water should form the feature of any successful park. Without its reflecting surface any park will lose at least half of its beauty. Public parks as we understand them are designed for rest of body and spirit. Water in action may be said to be one of the greatest factors of delight and desirability for public recreation."

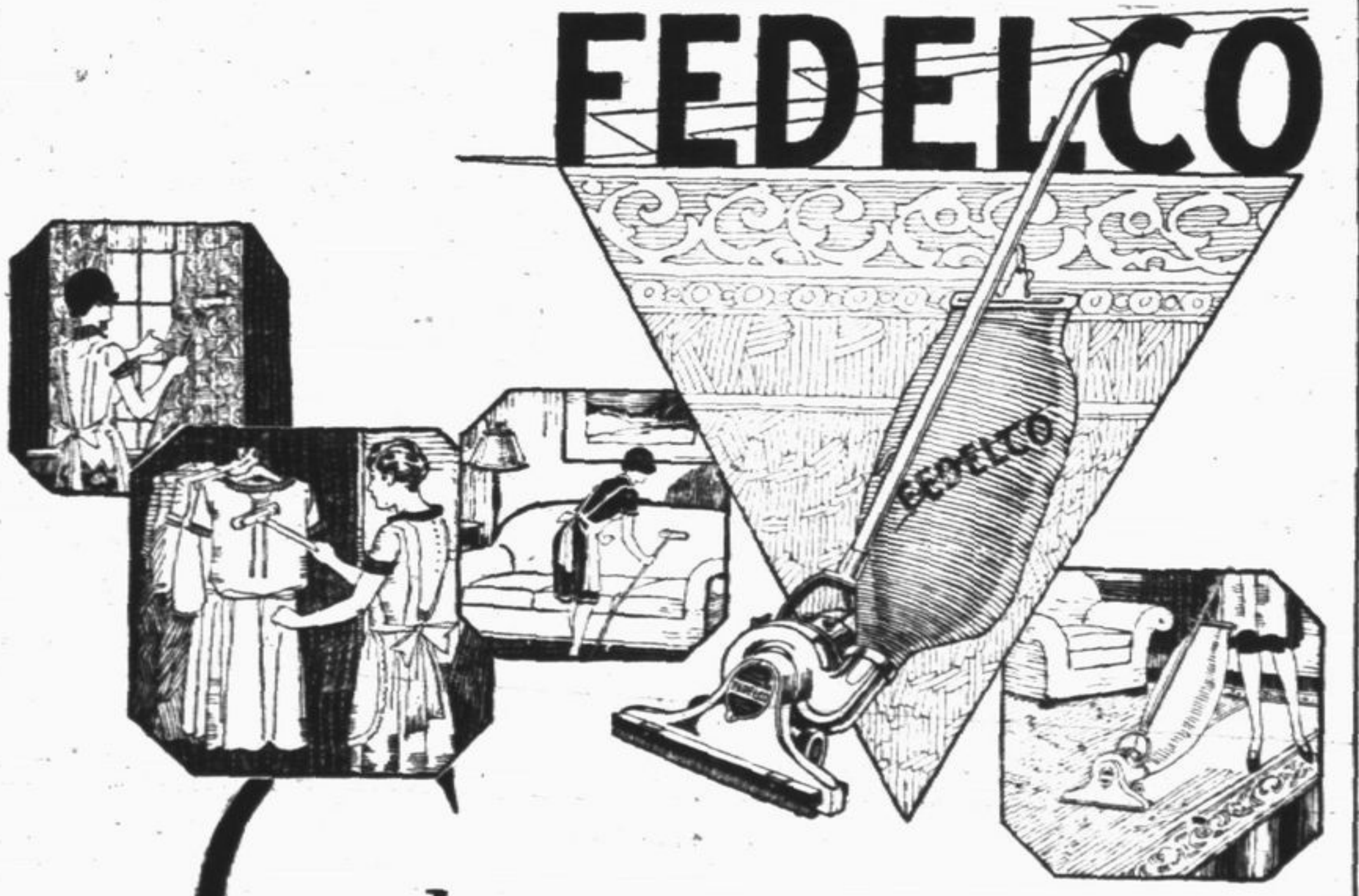
