Boy Scout News

A meeting of the finance chairmen of the various town Boy Scout committees has been called by the general finance chairman, Henry Eowler, for Tuesday evening, Sept. 27. At this meeting final plans for the raising of the annual budget of the North Shore Area council will be worked out. The general procedure will be as last year, each town organizing its committee to raise its share of the general fund.

How Money Is Spent

The money raised is used in the following items in the council budget: salary of scout executive, assistant executive and clerical help; traveling expense in going from town to town, in visiting troops, conferring with heads of institutions sponsoring troops, and with committeemen; office rent, light, telephone, etc.; office equipment, files, etc.; office supplies, stationery, printing, forms, etc.; equipment for hikes and camping such as stove for "the Cabin in the Woods," cots, etc., cooking utensils, etc.; in training courses for scout leaders, notebooks, printed matter, books, etc.; for rallies, trophies, field day, etc.; for educational publicity, used in keeping the public, and scout parents particularly in touch with scouting aims and progress, quarterly reports to "stockholders" or contributors to the scout work. These and many other items are included in the year's budget as drawn up by the committee on finance and budget.

Work Grows Rapidly

Scouting has almost doubled in numbers during the past year in the area served by the North Shore Area council, thus making desirable a larger budget for a growing service.

Enroll for Training Course

The committee on leadership reports a good enrollment in the training course on "The Nature and Needs of Boys" which will open next Monday night, Sept. 26, at the Glencoe Union church. More enrollments are coming in daily. Almost every scout leader in the area and many fathers of scouts, teachers of church school classes, etc., are planning to attend at least a part of the sessions.

Boy Leaders Meet Saturday

The annual election of officers will take place next Saturday at the opening session of the Junior Officers conference. The conference includes all boy officers of the troops and has met monthly during the past year. Plans for the coming year, including the council publication "The Talk O' Th' Troops" will be discussed.
