BAGGAGE MAN IN ROLE OF EDUCATOR

Distributes Newspapers from Train to Poor Whites of Mountains

Robert M. Cobb, baggage master on the Southern railway, has come to be regarded as the greatest source of education in the south by mountaineers along the line between Atlanta, Ga., and Salisbury, N. C.

When the whistle of the express begins to echo down the passes and valleys, the mountain people, many of whom go to town only once or twice a year, begin trekking toward the railroad and, when the train has roared through, they find in the clearings at certain spots large bundles of newspapers and magazines which Cobb hurls from the racing train.

Until a few months ago trainmen piled all the abandoned papers and books in the baggage car to be destroyed at the end of the division. Cobb then developed the scheme of bundling them and, after conferring with mountaineers he met on their infrequent visits to towns, told them where he would drop the packages. The result is the creation of a circulating library that provides practically all of the reading matter available to the mountain people.

HOME SUBSTITUTES FOR SODA FOUNTAIN

All the best products of the public soda fountain and more and now being rivaled in modern homes at small expense, says the Woman's Home Companion in divulging the secrets of the glittering palaces of iced refreshments.

The old stand-by syrups of the soda fountain which may be kept available at home are typified by a recipe for mocha chocolate syrup in which one-fourth of a cup of ground coffee is used.

Ice cream pie is an improvement even on the soda fountain. Crusts can be baked in cup shapes over the outside of muffin pans, cooled, filled with fruit and ice cream and then covered with meringue, which can be browned quickly in a hot oven without melting the ice cream.

6100 square yards of reinforced concrete pavement, eight (8) inch thick, curb and gutter combined curb and gutter near the center line of the pavement 1 1/2 (1 1/2) inch curb, including curing by using two (2) pounds of calcium chloride spread evenly over each square yard of pavement, including cleaning said pavement; laid complete at Two Dollars Forty-five Cents (\$2.45) per square yard \$15,555.00

6250 lineal feet of concrete combined curb and gutter 2 1/2 (2 1/2) inch curb, and 1 1/2 (1 1/2) inch for the exposed surface to a depth of one-half (1/2) inch, including curing, complete at No Dollars Eighty-five Cents (.85) per lineal foot \$8,522.50

30 concrete catchbasin manholes, constructed of monolithic concrete or concrete blocks; bottom eight (8) inch thick, walls six (6) inch thick, inside diameter four (4) feet, average depth of concrete seven (7) feet, and average depth of excavation is nine and nine-tenths (9.9) feet below the finished grade of the pavement. The concrete shall be of 1:2:4 mix, and the mortar of 1:2 mix. Each catchbasin shall be furnished with a Highland Park Pattern catchbasin cover, except catch basin manholes Nos. 34, 35, 36, 37, and 38, in Ridge Road, which shall be furnished with a manhole cover with perforated lid. Covers shall be set to grade where located; including all excavating, backfilling around the catchbasin manholes with sand, and removal of all surplus excavated materials, complete at Ninety Dollars No Cents (.90) each \$2,700.00

75 square yards of bituminous binder macadam pavement for driveway connection in Ridge Road at Cedarwood Road; said pavement shall be twelve (12) inches thick, bonded with four (4) gallons of tar or its equal, per square yard, and top dressed with a one-half (1/2) inch layer of one-quarter (1/4) inch gravel, including all excavation and removal of all surplus excavated materials, complete at Two Dollars Seventy-five Cents (\$2.75) per square yard \$206.25
