Too Many Committees

Gasoline Largest Item and Automobiles Are Cause; One To Every 5 Persons

Shipments of automobile freight last year totalled in excess of 3,280, 000 freight car loads, gasoline leading the list with 810,000 carloads, according to the Chicago Motor club.

There is one automobile to every five persons in the United States, and one to every 66 persons in the world, according to commercial reports received by the club, and the growing use of automotive equipment outside the United States is shown in figures which reveal a total of 5,512,933 motor vehicles in foreign lands at the beginning of this year, as against 2,-931,407 on January 1, 1914.




