SAYS ENGINEER IS THE FARMER'S HOPE

NO FAITH IN POLITICIANS

Writer In Magazine Declares Scientific Methods Will Do More Than Legislation, Belief

The engineer and not the congress man will be the Moses to lead the farmer out of his wilderness of troubles, in the opinion of Harry Burgess Roe, professor of agricultural engineering at the University of Minnesota, expressed in an article in the October Scribner's Magazine.

"Twenty-five to fifty years ago the farmer had little use for the professional engineer and his work," writes Mr. Roe. "He felt largely able, by himself, to handle his mechanical problems. But, with the opening up of the vast farming regions of the Northwest, resulting in larger farm units, new climatic conditions, and greater quantity production, new farming problems have arisen so rapidly and in such numbers that the farmer has found himself unable to solve them alone and unaided by scientific help.

Reserve Broken Down

His traditional reserve, therefore, has largely broken down during the past quarter century, so that he has profited immensely by the great development along purely scientific lines in agriculture, in combating plant and animal disease, in crop improvement through seed selection and plant breeding, in livestock improvement through good breeding and sire selection, and in good business methods based on sound economic princiequipment, and in good soil and tillage Borden Yacht. conditions resulting from wise use of irrigation and drainage. COLLECTION OF ALASKAN BIRDS IN FIELD MUSEUM

From Coast and Islands of Behring Sea and Brought by Borden Expedition

One hundred and thirteen birds of the Alaskan coast and the islands of the Bering Sea and the Bering Straits, collected on the recent John Borden-Field Museum Alaskan expedition, have just been brought to the Field Museum of Natural History, it was announced recently by D. C. Davies, director of the museum,

The birds, many of them of rare species, were brought by the collector, Ashley Hine, last member of the Borden expedition to return to Chicago from the Pacific coast, where the expedition yacht, Northern Light, has been laid up. Mr. Hine is a member of the museum's zoological staff. The birds will be mounted within the next few months and placed on exhibition in the museum's systematic collection of North American birds.


