CADWELL FAMILIES IN DEEFIELD IN 1835

(Continued from page 1)

4, 1846, which denounced the Illinois "Black Law."

s as follows:

"Jacob and Rubie Rich Cadwell with school. their seven children, five sons and two daughters, moved from Addison county, Vermont to Illinois in the year 1835. The father and four sons preempted government land in Lake county upon a portion of which the village of Deerfield was later located.

1. Orren Madison Cadwell, the eldest son and his wife, Polly Patterson Cadwell, were the parents of seven children-Mrs. O. M. Cadwell died August 3, 1846. One of Madison Cadwell's sons, Caleb, married Annie Mc-Craren and has a son Dr. Chaster Tupper Cadwell, who is an eye, ear, nose and throat specialist in Poughkeepsie, New York.

2. Rubie Rosella Cadwell married Richard Hendee, February 15, 1847. They had three children, who died in infancy. Richard R. Hendee died May 31, 1853.

Orren Madison Cadwell, his son, George and family, and Mrs. R. R. Hendee moved to California in 1864. Orren M. Cadwell died December 7 1887. He has a granddaughter and a great-granddaughter living in Arizona, and others living in Oregon.

Mrs. R. R. Hendee married Stillman Moulton, July 3, 1880. Mr. Moulton died December 4, 1887. Mrs. Moulton died March 24, 1909, at the age of ninety-eight years and seven months.

3. Philemon Cadwell married Electa Clarilla Hendee, February 27, 1845. They had ten children, five of whom died in infancy, and one of their twin daughters, Ellen Adelia, died November 9, 1867, at the age of thirteen years. The remainder of the family moved to California in 1868. Philemon Cadwell died January 14, 1882, Electa C. Cadwell died July 2, 1909. A son of Philemon, Hiram G. Cadwell, died August 20, 1876. Helen Amelia, twin sister of Ellen Adelia, married Frank H. Mabury, March 22, 1874. Helen A. Mabury died August 19, 1914. Richard Grant Cadwell married Susanne Rogers September 2, 1887. R. G. Cadwell died November 10, 1921. Annie Lorette Cadwell married John H. Titcomb, November 21, 1880. Mrs. Annie L. Titcomb is living in San Jose, Calif., and there are grand-children and great-grandchildren living in Oklahoma and Cali-

4. Caleb Cadwell married Eleanor Galloway, November 8, 1842. They had five children. Two sons passed away in infancy. Charles grew to manhood. Eleanor Galloway Cadwell died August 13, 1862.

Caleb Cadwell married for his second wife, Harriet R. Chittenden, March 4, 1863. The family lived in Waukegan, Ill., for several years before going to California with the family of Philemon Cadwell in 1868. Caleb Cadwell died August 13, 1883. Cornelia E. Cadwell married John H. Russell in 1869. Cornelia E. Russell died in March 1917. Frances E. Cadwell married Charles Raymond in 1885. Frances E. Raymond died in 1896. There is a granddaughter, Miss Jessie E. Russell living in Washington, D. C. and two grandsons, Gilbert H. Russell in Berkeley, Calif., and Bert C. Raymond in San Francisco, Calif.

5. Edwin Cadwell married Mary Duffy, March 4, 1854, in Deerfield. They moved to Iowa in 1855. Edwin Cadwell died January 13, 1910, in San Jose, Calif. One daughter, Mrs. Etta Symonds lives near Santa Clara, Calif., and two daughters, Mrs. Affie Stewart and Mrs. Nellie Lazenby live in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. There are grandchildren and great-grandchildren in Iowa, Colorado and California.

6. Jerusha Rosina Cadwell and William P. Welch were married Aug. 29, 1847. They also moved to Iowa in 1855. Jerusha Rosina Welch died January 29, 1897. William P. Welch died September 26, 1900.

Their three daughters grew to womanhood-Amanda M. married Charles Ribble; Emma R. married Charles Brown, and Rubie E. married Richard Martin. Mrs. Emma R. Brown is living in San Jose, Calif. There are grandchildren and great-grandchildren living in Iowa, California and Washington."

Mrs. Lewis Beecher was Isabel Cadwell's mother. The Beecher home was the one occupied by the late C. W. Pettis for over forty years, on Lincoln avenue. Lewis Beecher was the first postmaster in Deerfield appointed in 1854. His widow, whose first husband was James Cadwell (one of the five sons of Jacob Cadwell) afterwards married Clinton Warren. In the Deerfield cemetery are the graves of Clinton Warren, Richard Hendee (whose tombstone records his death as May 30, 1855 at the age of fiftyfour years); Anson P. Cadwell who died August 3, 1856, age one year and five months; Joseph P. Cadwell who died July 18, 1863, age 24 years; Eleanor and Galloway Cadwell, Betsy Beecher, wife of Lewis Beecher, died Lawrence 2, 1969, and Campage S. Paragarantees. January 3, 1862, and George S. In 1840 Deerfield township was called Le Clair in honor of an influential half breed, French and Indian, Pierre Le Clair, who lived at the Indian village near Half Day. The polling place was fixed at the house advanced study at the Sorbonne, Paris. of Jacob Cadwell. An election was set for January 8, 1841, to choose two justices of the peace. On the same day Oak precinct was to choose two constables. In the first session of the Circuit court of the seventh circuit held in Lake county, convened in the school house in Burlington, in April 1840, Judge Pearson presided. Among the petit jurors were Job. W. Tripp, Milton Shields and Lewis Beecher, of this vicinity.

No member of the Cadwell family and none of the descendents live in Deerfield, yet their influence on the early histry of the village was momentous. A street might be appropriately named for one of the fam-


