### INFANT WELFARE HEAR

MRS. FRANK SWANSON Name Officers for Ensuing Year; Praise Mrs. Glace for Two Year's Work

Mrs. Frank E. Swanson of La Grange, president of the Woman's auxiliary of the Infant Welfare society of Chicago, was the speaker at the last meeting of the Highland Park-Ravinia center of the Infant Welfare society, held at the home of Mrs. A. J. Metzler, Sycamore place.

Mrs. Swanson expressed great pleasure in the fact that now there are Infant Welfare centers in all of the north shore towns as far north as Lake Bluff.

There are twenty-three centers and six Junior organizations, extending from Woodlawn on the south, to Lake Bluff on the north and west to Hinsdale.

The object of the Infant Welfare society is to reduce the infant death rate and improve the health of the coming generation by keeping the baby well, before its birth by caring for the mother and after its birth by teaching her how to feed and care for her child.

There are twenty-seven Infant Welfare stations in Chicago.

Mothers bring their babies to these stations where they are examined by a doctor.

Volunteer workers from the centers help weigh the babies. The nurse teaches the mother in her home how to follow out the doctor's instruction. Over 100,000 visits were made by the nurses in 1926.

Mrs. Swanson paid a well deserved tribute to the work of Mrs. John R. Glace, president of the Highland Park-Ravinia center, for her earnest and efficient work the past two years in building up this center.
