HOW NEW CONGRESS IS MADE UP TOLD

BOTH SENATE AND HOUSE

First Session of Seventieth U. S. Assembly Now in Progress; Members and Their Status

Congress is in session. The first session of the Seventieth congress elected in November, 1926, opened Monday, Dec. 5. The unofficial roll shows that the House to be composed of 237 Republicans, 195 Democrats, 2 Farmer-Labor, 1 Socialist. The Republicans have a majority of forty-two over the Democrats and forty-one over all. The senate, including Vane and Smith who are on the temporary roll, consists of 48 Republicans, 47 Democrats and 1 Farmer-Labor. With Smith of Illinois and Vane of Pennsylvania admitted, the Republicans have a majority of one over the Democrats. If Shipstead votes with the Democrats, the party strength will be a tie, and Vice President Dawes will be called on to cast the deciding vote.

New Senators

The new senators are Charles W. Waterman, of Colorado, who succeeds Rice W. Means; Colonel Frederick Steiwer of Oregon, who succeeds Robert N. Stanfield; John J. Blaine, of Wisconsin who succeeds Irvine L. Lenroot; Robert F. Wagner, of New York, who defeated James W. Wadsworth; Hugo Black, of Alabama, who succeeds Oscar W. Underwood, who retired; Samuel G. Bratton, of New Mexico, who succeeds H. O. Bursum, Republican, whom he defeated; Elmer Thomas of Oklahoma, who succeeds John W. Harreld; Millard E. Tydings, of Maryland, who succeeds O. E. Wheeler; Carl Hayden, of Arizona, who succeeds Ralph H. Cameron; Albin W. Barkley, of Kentucky, who succeeds Richard P. Ernst. Smith W. Brookhart returns to the upper house from Iowa in succession to David W. Stewart, who was appointed to fill and later elected to the vacancy caused by the death of Albert B. Cummings.

In the House

On the house side five men will make their bow who have obtained their places by reason of election since November, 1926: S. Harrison White, Democrat, who succeeds the late Congressman William N. Vaile, Republican in the First Colorado district; Charles Tatgenhorst, Jr., Republican, who succeeds the late A. E. B. Stephens, Republican of the Second Ohio district; Clarence E. Hancock, Republican, of the 35th New York, who succeeds the late Walter Warren Magee; R. L. DeRouen, Democrat, of the Seventh Louisiana, who

succeeds the late Ladislav Lazaro; Franklin K. Korell, Republican, who succeeds the late M. E. Crumpacker, from the 3rd Oregon.

Congressman Charles Manly Stedman, Democrat, of the Fifth North Carolina is the oldest member of the house. He will be 87 years of age the 29th of January. He is distinguished as the one Confederate Army veteran in congress. The youngest member of the house is George H. Combs, Jr., Democrat, of the Fifth Missouri (Kansas City) district.

Oldest Senator

The oldest member of the senate is Senator Warren of Wyoming. He will be 84 years of age the 20th of next June. Senator Warren is the only Union veteran in the senate and also has the record of longest service in the upper house. He has served continuously since March 4, 1895. He also served from December 1, 1890, to March 4, 1893. In other words, he has been a senator of the United States since December, 1890, to the present with the exception of only two years — or an aggregate service of approximately 35 years. In the house, only Henry Allen Cooper, of Wisconsin with 32 years of service (not continuous) and Thomas S. Butler, of Pennsylvania, with 30 years of continuous service approach Senator Warren's record.

ATTY. O. FUQUA HEADS BAR ASSOCIATION

Attorney Okel Fuqua of Waukegan was elected president of the Lake County Bar association for the ensuing year at a meeting of the organization held last week in the Circuit court room. There were attorneys from all sections of the country at the annual meeting.

City Attorney Max L. Przyborski of North Chicago was elected vice president and Attorney Harold J. Hansen of Waukegan was elected secretary-treasurer. Circuit Judge Claire C. Edwards and Probate Judge Martin C. Decker were named executive committee members. All offices were filled by unanimous vote.

USE CARE IN GEAR SHIFT IN WINTER

Mechanism Clogged With Chilled Oil May Be Broken Easily; How to Handle

The mechanical first aid department of the Chicago Motor club issues a bulletin warning motorists against using more than usual strength to put a car in gear these cold mornings when the grease in the transmission has hardened. The first step toward avoiding this trouble is to see that the transmission lubricant is as light as possible. "The next thing to do," says the bulletin, "is to use the gear shift lever gently, working it back and forth into every gear combination until the congealed lubricant has loosened up enough to make the shifts relatively easy."

"Gear shift levers can be broken, especially in freezing weather, and there is no more effective way to put a car out of commission."
