PLAN TRADE CRUISE TO CARIBBEAN SEA

ILLINOIS MANUFACTURERS

Chamber of Commerce Organizing Trip and Steamer Will Be Chartered to Leave January 28

South and Central America and the islands bordering the Caribbean Sea are the greatest potential market for the products of the United States in the entire world. John H. Camlin of Rockford, president of the Illinois Chamber of Commerce, said recently. Mr. Camlin pointed out that trade with so-called Latin America increased more than 40 per cent in 1926 over 1925.

"The world war brought about a great change in our relations with our neighbors on the south," said Mr. Camlin, "during the war these nations were forced to turn to the United States for goods they needed."

"For four hundred years they had been sending their sons to European universities. The world war forced them to send them to universities in the United States. They are continuing to do so because they like the sort of education they got here. So they are coming to know our goods, to know us and to think as we think."

"These things mean closer relations between the Americas, North and South, and the Central Americas and the islands in between for all time. It is because we want Illinois business men and Illinois manufacturers to know these lands and these markets more intimately that we are organizing a good-will trade cruise to Caribbean Sea lands to sail in January."

"The S. S. Cartago has been chartered and the cruise will be limited to seventy-eight persons. We will leave Chicago on January 26 and sail from New Orleans on Jan. 28. WHEN IS EVENING PAPER? QUESTION

DEPENDS ON PUBLICATION

Some Printed Day Before, Others Morning After, Says Report; Experts in Quandary on Subject

Is an evening newspaper, which is printed the day before date of publication or some time during the dark hours before dawn, an evening newspaper or is it a morning newspaper? That apparently simple question has for five years had the serious attention of publishers, advertisers and advertising agents of the United States and Canada at annual meetings of the Audit Bureau of Circulation held recently in Chicago.

The newspaper division this week recommended a solution to the general assembly of the convention in session which was intended to settle the perennial question—but it did not and the problem, after further debate by some of the nation's outstanding publishers has been referred to the A.B.C. board of directors.

The directors were instructed to study the problem again and to submit to a mail vote of the entire membership a rule expected to identify a morning newspaper from an evening one.

Discussion brought out the statement from S. R. Winch of Portland, Ore., that 79 so-called evening papers and 54 self-styled morning newspapers in the United States issue the pre-dated editions. Some papers, announced as morning newspapers, are to be purchased during the afternoon of the day prior to the date they bear.

J. Murray Gibbon, of Montreal, Canada, retiring first vice-president of the bureau, was applauded when he reported that the 175 Canadian members had no problems to present to the convention and recommended that those wishing to view a harmonious group of publishers, advertisers and agents could do so by visiting Canada.
