

ARTIFICIAL SUN TO HEAT NEW SYNAGOGUE

TRIED OUT IN AMSTERDAM

New Scientific Method of Providing Warmth Is Said to Be Successful; Details Given

Imitation of the sun as means for heating churches and other rooms with high ceilings has been originally and successfully applied in Amsterdam.

Two electrical heat reflectors have been placed on the lower part of the ceiling of the building, enabling the heat rays to reach everybody in the auditorium with its seating capacity of 250 people.

It occurred to Dr. Lulofs that the rays of the sun, coming from an almost incomprehensible distance, impart very little of their heat to the surrounding air.

Old systems of heating churches have often been very unsatisfactory. Advance heating is necessary in most cases, and the hot air, mounting to the top of the building, causes cold drafts.

STATE TAX IS CUT FOR ENSUING YEAR

CHANGE IN SCHEDULE

Reduction of Five Cents on the Hundred Dollars Is Reported in Statement From State Auditor

Economy in state expenditures has permitted the state tax board, consisting of Governor Len Small, State Auditor Oscar Nelson and Treasurer Garret D. Kinney, to hand to the tax payers of Illinois a substantial Christmas present in a reduced tax rate.

The rate as fixed is thirty cents on the one hundred dollar valuation, based on the full assessed valuation under the provisions of the change made by the fifty-fifth general assembly. This is five cents less on the hundred dollar valuation as compared to the rate for 1926 when the rate was sixty-five cents, based on the former schedule.

Second Consecutive Reduction The lower rate is the second consecutive reduction in the two years period, representing a cut of five cents over the schedule for 1926 and a still further reduction, totalling twenty-five cents on the rate effective for 1925.

The principal reduction comes in the cut which it has been possible to make in the rate for the general revenue fund. This reduction is approximately eight and one-half cents on the one hundred dollars.

Fractional increases in the rate of the state school fund, soldiers' compensation fund, and Illinois waterway bond fund are made, with the addition of the blind relief fund for which a tax rate of one cent per one hundred dollars of valuation is fixed.

Formal Statement Issued With the announcement of the lower tax rate the following statement was issued by the tax board:

"A Christmas present to the tax payers of the state in a further tax reduction was made at the annual meeting of the state tax board, composed of the governor, the auditor and the treasurer. Through economy in the administration of the state government a healthy balance has accumulated in the state treasury, a large part of which consists of unexpended balances carried forward from the last biennial.

"The state tax rate for the year 1927 was fixed at 30 cents on the \$100 assessed valuation.

"The last general assembly changed the basis of assessment from one-half to full value, which makes the thirty cent rate set today equivalent to a sixty cent rate on the 1926 basis—a reduction of five cents in the total state tax rate notwithstanding the new item of one cent added this year for the blind relief fund.

"The board considers that the rates fixed will meet the necessary demands and provide a reasonable working balance, taking into account estimated receipts from other indirect taxes, department earnings, interest and fees."

PLAN NEW HIGHWAY TO CIRCLE LONDON

A great circular road around London at an average distance of 20 miles from Charing Cross is gradually coming into existence. It is all planned and designed for the tremendous growth which is taking place near the great metropolis, but will be in course of construction for a number of years, according to the Christian Science Monitor.

At the present time a continually increasing volume of freight, both import and export, either destined for or originating in the center and north of England is dispatched by motor transport to or from Tilbury, the Port of London, Southampton, and other maritime centers.

The new circular road, of which the northern half will be the first to be completed, will divert traffic around London, saving, much time. It will skirt Tilbury, Brentwood, Hatfield, St. Albans, Rickmansworth and Colbrook, intersecting the new completed roads from London to Tilbury and London to Southend.

A good deal of the new project will take in roads already in existence, the present thoroughfares being widened and straightened. Where satisfactory connecting sections do not exist, the government has already bought the necessary land for extensions and it is expected that completion of the entire enterprise will now go steadily forward.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PARK BONDS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT IN THE SUM OF TWENTY-TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$22,000.00), AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF.

WHEREAS, The Highland Park East Park District is a duly organized Park District under the laws of the State of Illinois, and is charged with the duty of acquiring and maintaining a public park or parks in said district;

WHEREAS, said District has purchased suitable tracts of land for park purposes at a price in excess of Twenty-two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000.00) and does not have sufficient funds to pay the same; and this Board finds that it is for the best interests of said District that Twenty-two Thousand Dollars (\$22,000.00) be borrowed for that purpose and bonds be issued therefor;

NOW, THEREFORE, for the purpose of providing funds with which to pay the price of such lands:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT, OF LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1. There shall be, and there are hereby directed to be issued, twenty-two (22) Park Bonds of this District of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, to be dated January 15, 1928, all bearing interest at the rate of five per cent (5%) per annum, payable semi-annually, such interest to be evidenced by interest notes or coupons attached to said bonds respectively.

Said bonds shall mature in accordance with the following schedule:

SECTION 2. Except as to number and date of maturity, said bonds and coupons shall be in substantially the following form:

THE HIGHLAND PARK EAST PARK DISTRICT PARK BOND KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That the Highland Park East Park District, in the County of Lake and State of Illinois, a park district legally organized and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois, acting by and through its Board of Commissioners, do hereby certify that the bonds hereof are hereby irrevocably pledged.

SECTION 3. That for the purpose of providing for the payment of principal and interest of said bonds as same become due and payable, there shall be and there is hereby levied a continuing direct annual tax upon all the taxable property in the Highland Park East Park District sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds as same mature, and that there be and is hereby levied a tax upon all of the taxable property in said Park District sufficient to produce the following sums for the following years, respectively:

SECTION 4. That interest and principal on said bonds shall be paid at any time when there are in the current funds on hand in payment of the current taxes, and that there be and is hereby levied a tax upon all of the taxable property in said Park District sufficient to produce the following sums for the following years, respectively:

SECTION 5. That a certified copy of this ordinance be filed in the office of the County Clerk of Lake County, Illinois, and such Clerk shall annually compute the rate necessary to produce the foregoing sums in the foregoing years.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
